# Basketball all-stars play tonight

Milby respectively. The basketball game will be played tonight at 7:30 p.m. in the Dallas Convention Center arena. The North holds a 17-13 advantage in the series.

The Aggies will have two quarterbacks in Thursday's fray, one on each team. Mike Mosley from Humble and Rhett Butler Darnell from De Kalb will be calling the signals for the Rebs and Yanks respectively. Darnell may have more of a problem seeing action than Mosley as Odessa's Darrell Shepherd and Port Neches Groves' Ricky Ethridge are other quarterbacks on the North squad.

The other A&M recruits are Elroy Steen, a defensive back from Gonzales playing for the South and Doug Carr, a lineman from Gainesville with the North group. Mosley is the most heralded of the five quarterback recruits signed

by the Aggies. He gained 321 yards on 12 carries in one game last fall—in the first half. He operated the Wishbone offense while at Humble, the same attack used by Emory Ballard. Mosley is a versatile athlete, also running track in addition to football. He set a state record in the 120-yard hurdles with a 13.6 clock-

ing and was third in the 100-yard dash.

Mosley's 6-2, 175 lb. frame is a little light by most standards, but it was enough to carry him for 3,000 yards and Humble to the state quarterfinals.

The football game will be held in the Cotton Bowl at 7:30 p.m. This is

the 43rd meeting of the Texas all-star gridders with the North holding a 24-15-3 lead in the series.

Until 1957, the teams were coached by college coaches. This year, Al Dennis from Baytown Sterling will handle the South while his counterpart will be Sherman's Tommy Hudspeth.

## Foyt heads Speedway field

The green flag for the Indy of the Southwest will drop at 3:15 p.m. this Sunday as Texas World Speedway hosts the American Parts 200.

Six Indianapolis 500 winners, including four-time Indy 500 champ A. J. Foyt, will be amongst the 26-car field. The 100-lap, 200-mile race is sponsored by American Parts System, Inc., thus the name American Parts 200.

The race will be for national championship points and is sanctioned by the United State Auto Club for the championship (Indy-type) cars. There are only 15 such races in the country including the Indianapolis 500.

In addition to Foyt, Texas' Johnny Rutherford, Al Unser, Gordon Johncock and Bobby Unser are former Indy champions competing in Sunday's race.

Also offering stiff competition will be Tom Sneva, who is currently leading in points toward the national championship Citicorp Cup, Roger McCluskey, Wally Dallenbach and Pancho Carter.

Foyt, the local favorite, will be seeking his 60th championship car victory. Win No. 58 was his unprecedented fourth triumph at Indianapolis earlier this year. Mario Andretti with 32 wins and Al Unser with 31 are the only drivers ever to have won half of Foyt's total.

Foyt won five straight pole positions at the Speedway during 1976 and won last year's Texas 500 stock car race for his first win in the state of Texas. Thus, he does have some experience with running the two-mile Speedway oval.

A Pick the Winner contest will be sponsored by Speedway officials before the race with a prize \$200 going to the winner.

Contestants must pick the first three finishers correctly to win the cash. In case of a tie, the person who guesses closest to the average speed of the race will be the winner. Neither purchase nor attendance is required, but entry blanks must be deposited before 2:30 p.m. on July 31.

Indy car practices will be held this Saturday at 1 p.m. followed by two Datsun Challenge Series races at 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. A concert will be staged at 8 p.m. Saturday.

The time trials for the races will start at 11 a.m. Sunday followed by the Media Match race and the finals of the Datsun Challenge Series.

The Texas A&M Board of Regents congratulated Aggie Coach Tom Chandler for service and performance during 19 years at the school.

The Board adopted a resolution congratulating Chandler for being named to the American Association College Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame as well as one praising his performance as head coach.

Chandler, whose teams have won Southwest Conference titles during this year's crown, was named National Collegiate Athletic Association District VI Coach of the Year.

The Board lauded Chandler for providing inspired leadership and demonstrating an outstanding degree of proficiency and dedication.

In another baseball note, Aggie pitcher Mark Thurmond has been named to the NCAA Academic all-America team.

Thurmond, a junior, posted a 3.4 point average last semester for a possible 4.0.

Thurmond posted a 10-2 record in the Aggies last season and was a team all-America choice. He is playing with an American all-star team touring Japan.

Texas A&M golf prospect Mark Taylor of Rockford, Ill. won the State Junior Championships recently. Taylor will join Coach Ellis' squad next spring.

Aggie fullback George Woodward, a runner who is definitely hard to stop — any opposing defender. Woodward was brought to a

halt voluntarily recently — at the alter. Woodward married his hometown sweetheart Eilan Daryell in the Enterprise Baptist Church of Bay City last weekend. Woodward will be a junior at Texas A&M.
