Willie has fans in California too

SAN CARLOS, Calif. — Wearing a ragged tee-shirt, jogging shoes and cradling his guitar with a hole worn through, Willie Nelson steps into the spotlights.

"Whiskey river, take my mind ...," he begins — this time for a Northern California audience.

Now, we know the audiences love him back home, but how does this Texas music hero fare on those far-ranging road trips deep into the heart of Yankee land — or swinging California?

"I guess Buffalo ain't geared to me and Paul," Willie sadly sings in one song kept current in the Nelson repertoire. His implication is that upper New York state isn't the only place north of the Red River where the welcome is less than enthusiastic.

That is not the case at this particular spot on the map of the North, a community on the San Francisco peninsula not exactly steeped in the Bob Wills tradition. Willie does just fine.

He drew thousands in a week-long engagement at the Circle Star, normally a forum for rollers and jazz greats, and himself tipping a horn-sweatstained Stetson in the same unabashed outdoor appreciation he gets in Dallas, Worth or Austin.

"We love you, Willie," "The Bay Area loves you," "Same here," Nelson called in the middle of "Hello Walking Sunday night's performance."

The Californians stomped, cheered, bought Willie's T-shirts, drank beer and were happy, some in pickup trucks, some in Western attire. There was also a sprinkling of older folks who seemed to have had a sunshine on their necks during the years.

Among the admirers was a do of a dozen or so mean-looking Angels motorcycle folk, fully formed and full of beer and no one was sure if they were posed to be there as they were backstage after the show.

Willie was hugged by the ladies, signed autographs, signed one on somebody's check — and promised to "listen sometime" to a cassette thrust at him by a young writer.

A bottle of California champagne was conveyed to the Nelson by a stagehand, and the musicians passed around between licks, all but one whose onstage refreshment mained the Lone Star beer-cases — he brought with him Texas.

Nelson said he likes his new in California. "It's the third time we've here and it gets a little better time," he said after the date at Circle Star's revolving stage-kind of hard to communicate the audience at this particular ter with the stage turning, but (audience) were great."
