Practice opens for SWC teams

Southwest Conference football teams opened fall practice last week, facing one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the SWC's 63 years of operation. Included on the nine school schedules are five of last season's top ten teams and 12 bowl selections, headed by second-ranked Southern Cal and third-ranked Michigan. Defending co-champion Houston and Baylor open fall training Tuesday, with the other seven reporting Thursday.

Baylor Coach Grant Teaff welcomed back a league-low of ten starters as Baylor begins preparations for a schedule which includes a home game with Peach Bowl winner Kentucky and a road test against Astro-Bluebonnet victor Nebraska. Biggest shoes to fill will include those of quarterback Mark Jackson and versatile all-America defensive back Gary Green.

Houston lost only four starters on both offense and defense, but two of those were all-SWC offensive tackle Val Belcher and all-America defensive tackle Wilson Whitley. However, the starting backfield of quarterback Danny Davis and running backs Alois Blackwell and Dyral Thomas returns intact as the Cougars set their sights on non-loop tilts against a pair of '76 bowl teams, UCLA and Penn State. The UH-UCLA game will be nationally televised the night of Monday, Sept. 12.

Arkansas, under new coach Lou Holtz, also gets its share of last year's top finishers as the Razorbacks host Tangerine Bowl winner Oklahoma State and Independence Bowl loser Tulsa on successive Saturdays in September. A league-high 43 lettermen return to help open the Holtz era.

Two other head coaches are nearing their first season in the SWC — Texas' Fred Akers and TCU's F. A. Dry.

A total of 12 returning starters, including a healthy Earl Campbell, will help usher in the 1-formation to the Texas offensive attack in the time for non-conference games against Oklahoma, Virginia and Boston College. Oklahoma won the '76 Fiesta Bowl after settling for a tie against Texas early in the season, while the Virginia game will mark that team's initial appearance against a SWC representative.

TCU's version of the "Dry Look" will feature one thing that hasn't changed — a tough non-conference schedule. Among the Frogs' opponents in '77 will be Rose Bowl champion Southern California and Miami, which holds an all-time

winning edge over the SWC. But Dry will see the return of 42 lettermen and 16 starters as a plus for the new campaign.

Besides Houston, the Southwest Conference sent both co-champion Texas Tech and Texas A&M on to post-season bowl games, in '76 and both squads return veteran units. The Raiders, defending SWC co-champs, return 16 starters and 42 lettermen. Peach Bowl participant North Carolina highlights Tech's non-conference schedule.

The Aggies, sporting a seven-game win streak, lost 12 starters off last season's Sun Bowl champions and eight of those were from the nationally-ranked defensive unit so coach Emory Ballard faces a big task replacing all-America Robert Jackson, Tank Marshall and Jimmy Dean. And he'll have to do it quickly as the Aggies travel to Ann Arbor on October 1 for a nationally televised tilt with powerful Michigan.

SMU continues a rebuilding program under second-year coach Ron Meyer, who finds 16 starters and 37 lettermen back from last season, including all but two defensive players. Meyer's first order of business will be to find a quarterback to replace Ricky Wesson in time for the Mustangs' initial encounter, a SWC clash with TCU Sept. 10. Then three weeks later (Oct. 1), SMU has a date in Dallas with Ohio State.

First-time opponents are on the regular-season schedules of five conference teams this fall as Arkansas hosts New Mexico State, Idaho is at Rice, Houston battles UCLA, Texas goes against Virginia and Tech plays at North Carolina.



Baker to coach Arkansas football

Former Texas A&M coach Shifton Baker, the Southwest Conference intermedia champion, has been named assistant track coach at the University of Arkansas.

Baker, 21, will be replacing the Razorback hurdler vaulters, long jumpers and high jumpers. He will also be doing veterinary medicine school work needed for admission to the University of Arkansas.

Baker lettered in track at the University of Arkansas during his senior year. He completed four for 11 in the 100-yard dash, and evading a Houston champion, has been named a stepping stone and years while at Texas A&M. Coach Charles Thomas said the Aggies high point was the junior and senior seasons. Baker owns lifetime bests of 14.8 seconds in the 120-yard high hurdle and 50.6 in the intermediate hurdle. He was also the SWC's national yard high champ last season.

Kirby wins most money at 2 rodeos

United Press International DENVER — Sandy Kirby won \$4,543 by competing in events at two weekend rodeos, Association of Professional Cowboys said Monday.

Kirby, a Greenville, Texas boy, won the average in all three rounds of barrel racing and took the all-around award.

He was also named champion of his two pools this week at the Sidney, Iowa rodeo. Kirby will be here to learn titration for his abilities in barrel racing and saddle bronc riding. He is a past winner of PRC national finals and a PRC national final rider.

Tom Ferguson of Miami, Texas held onto his lead in the division with total winnings of \$44,178. Ivan Daines of Ala., ranks first in saddle bronc riding with \$19,828.

In barrel bronc riding, Alexander of Cora, Wyo., won the top money with \$15,960 while Jimmy Valley Mills, Tex., remained the barrel racing champion with \$14,257.
