## "First person" camera sees through eyes

**NEW YORK** — GraeterVision, a system of "first person" photography, is the brainchild of an unlikely "electronic whiz."

The GraeterVision camera, which gives the viewer the same vantage point as the subject of the film, was developed by Jean Graeter. It enables a photographer to film, for example, open heart surgery through the eyes of the surgeon.

A valuable training tool, it had prosaic beginnings when the late Ralph Graeter, as art director for Life Magazine, was frustrated by the inability of photography to record, for instance, an auto mechanic at work through the mechanic's eyes, Jean Graeter said in an interview.

Mrs. Graeter, whose interest in electronics dates back to high school when she bought a model-T Ford in parts and put it together, "batted the idea around with my husband and little by little we came up with a working model."

They formed First Person Production Inc., with the idea of creating unique films using their system to prove its value to schools, hospitals and industry.

Graeter died suddenly in 1975, before the idea they had formulated could be carried out.

"But we had discussed the possibilities of GraeterVision, and it had become almost a crusade with us," Mrs. Graeter said.

Following her husband's death, "he was a brilliant man and a beautiful person" she continued to work and redesigned the system for greater portability and broader use. She obtained patents and began filming surgery in New York hospitals and making training films for manufacturing companies, including Sperry Univac and IBM Equipment.

"It solves a problem that has bothered the use of film as a medium," she said.

"For instance, how do you film a camera that reflects images of the person performing the action? The former has no physical contact with the optical assembly, which is rected by a production unit seated at a control console.

GraeterVision will be marketed by Lourdes Industries, a Hauppauge, N.Y., through a venture agreement announced on July 1. The system will be marketed commercially early in 1978 on a lease basis, and will be unveiled at the American College of Surgeons meeting in Dallas in August.

Mrs. Graeter, a slim, blonde, has been an innovative junior high school, which is the first female in the school's history to take woodwork in a shop, she said.

After school, she started an airplane parts and later formed her own company with her husband, which she later sold to a Latin American.

"I learned Spanish, and I did free-lance photography writing for the wire services."

She returned to New York before she met her husband and weekly newspaper in Manhattan.
