Pottery, weaving fill MSC Gallery

The Memorial Student Center gallery exhibit of clay and fiber is a fast escape from the hurried pace of the new semester.

The pottery items on display are creations by Rhoda Kramer, MSC pottery shop instructor. Kramer has exhibited her works through the Midwest in her six years as a potter. Kramer says she is fascinated by the functional as well as the artistic aspects of clay art. The natural beauty of the clay itself calls for designs inspired by nature, she said. These designs which comprise the majority of her work.

She has done graduate study at Sorbonne in Paris, France, the University of Wisconsin and Oxford College in Illinois and is a member of the Texas Potters Guild and the American Craft Council.

Penny Rupley, whose three-dimensional weavings are also on display, is a visiting lecturer in the Department of Educational Curriculum and Instruction.

Rupley has been working with weavings since 1971 but began early this year experimenting with three-dimensional weavings.

She says that the woven faces she creates have limitless possibilities for self-expression and are things people relate to.

Prior to creating weavings, her main interest was in abstract textural and paintings of faces and sculpture.

She is a member of Texas Designer Craftsman, Houston Designer Craftsman and American Crafts Council. She has exhibited her works in several shows and has done several commissioned pieces.

The exhibit will continue through Oct. 2 in the Gallery on the first floor of the MSC.
