Independence, skippered by Marblehead, Mass., sailmaker Ted Hood, was eliminated Monday from trials to determine which American boat will face a Swedish or Austra-lian challenger in finals beginning

Sverige must beat Australia today to keep alive its chances in a best-of-seven elimination series. Australia, a new 12-meter sailboat backed by Perth real estate tycoon Alan Bond, Monday logged its third straight win over the Swedes in winds of up to 20 knots on the

"We had more boat speed, up-wind and downwind," Bond said. "On the last leg we were protecting the boat from damage and not even putting on the pressure.


Australia skipper Noel Robins conservatively coasted to a 50second victory, recovering from a mishap at the fifth mark that shred-ded the yacht's yellow, green and white spinnaker sail.


