

CAP seeking missing planes

United Press International SAN ANTONIO — A total of 25 search aircraft spread from the Rio Grande Valley into Oklahoma yes-terday looking for two missing light planes carrying a total of four per-

Lt. Bill Schneider, flight opera tions officer of the 19th Civil Air Pa-trol Group, said a Cessna Skymaster with one persons aboard disap-peared Monday on a flight from Waco to the Rio Grande Valley, and a Piper Arrow carrying three persons also was reported missing Monday en route from Harlingen to MacAlister, Okla.

Schneider said J. Edwards Jr., 35, Oalhe, Kan., his son, Bradley Edwards, 13, and a woman iden-tified as Joyce Brandon were aboard the aircraft which was last sighted on the Houston radar screen at 3:15 p.m. Monday in the area of Bryan-Hearne in East Texas.


He said Larry Wade Gilley, 38, of Dallas, was on a roundtrip flight from Waco to the Lower Rio Grande Valley and it was not known whether he was still en route to the Valley or returning to Waco when

the plane was reported missing. Civil Air Patrol units from Mc-Allen, Waco, Temple, San Antonio and MacAlister, Okla., joined in the search.
