

Bears lose starting quarterbacks — Red Raiders worried about heat

LUBBOCK — Hot weather and rivalry between Texas Tech and Baylor will be big factors in both teams' season opener Saturday, head coach Steve Sloan said yesterday.

"It's going to be awful hot," said Sloan in his first weekly news conference of the season. "Conditioning, depth and being used to this type of weather will be a definite factor in the game."

Sloan said since the Raiders began their series against the Bears in 1939 the rivalry has always made the game important.

Sloan also noted playing the first game away from home requires some extra preparations.

"The Baylor-Texas Tech series has been a home series giving advantages to the home team," he said. "It would stabilize the team a great deal if they could play their first game at home. Players react a little better to familiar surroundings if you can open at home."

Playing at Baylor, Tech has won only twice in 14 tries while the Bears have beaten the Raiders eight times out of 20 attempts at Lubbock.

Bears prepare

WACO — Head coach Grant Teaff said yesterday he has not decided who will be the Baylor Bears starting quarterback during the season opener against Texas Tech Saturday.

Sophomore Sammy Bickham was named to the starting position last week, but was sidelined with a shoulder injury and has not practiced for 10 days. Bickham's backup, Greg Wood, suffered a severe ankle injury and will be out for several weeks.

"I honestly do not know what Sammy's situation will be," said Teaff in his weekly news conference, "but at this time we will start Scott Smith. I'm hopeful that Sammy can come along and play in the ball game, and we're going to try a shoulder pad that we're hoping will give Sammy some protection."

Teaff said he regretted playing Bickham before he recovered fully, but since the game was a Southwest Conference contest, he had little choice.

"If this were anything other than

a Southwest Conference football game," he said, "I would not even consider suiting Sammy up, much less consider playing him."

Teaff said trainer Skip Cox designed a shoulder pad that may allow Bickham to play, but unless the Plano, Tex., native can work out Monday or Tuesday it will be difficult for him to play.

Tech, which travels to Waco for the first time in three years, edged the Bears 24-21 in the season's finale last year.

There is a big rivalry between Texas Tech and Baylor coaches and players on the game will be played with a little bit more emotion," Sloan said. "Some people are going to play harder and a lot of extra effort will be exerted," he said.

Houston back lost for season

HOUSTON — Injury-prone running back Fred Willis underwent surgery and will be lost to the Houston Oilers this season.

"I'm sorry as hell for Freddy," said Oilers coach Bum Phillips. "No one has worked harder for us."

Phillips would not say it, but Willis, a starter last season, had lost his standing with the club. A sore shoulder forced Willis to miss most of training camp and he was considered the team's sixth back.

Solid choices to make the club are veterans Ronnie Coleman and Don Hardeman, and rookies Tom Wilson, Rob Carpenter and Bruce Belton.

Because of injuries in the Oilers' season game against the Dallas Cowboys, Houston's roster will not have to be trimmed much this week. Houston carried 52 players in the game and its roster must be cut to 48 today.

Offensive guard Bobby Simon suffered a knee injury and reserve back Art Stringer sprained his lower back in the Dallas game. The seriousness of their injuries was not known.

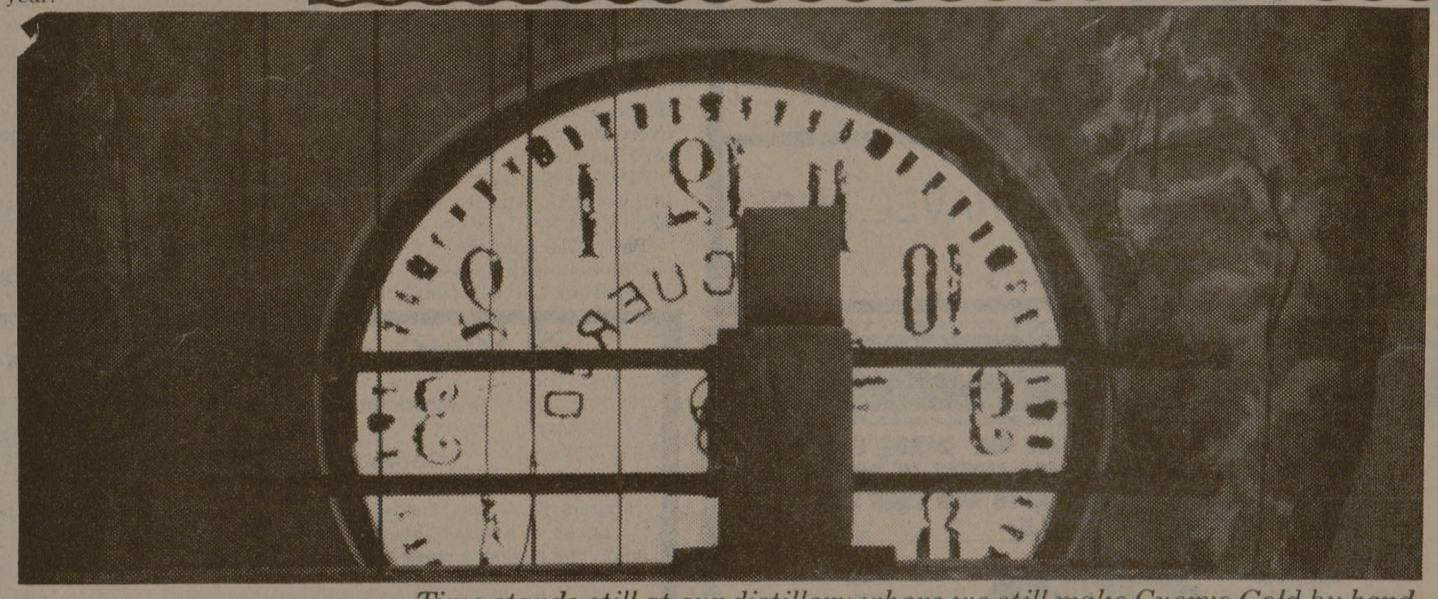
