"It is felt that the patient's muscle pasms were primarily due to salt electrolyte depletion due to pro-longed use of diuretics," Brelsford said. "This has been corrected and he is able to resume play."


Dickey will be crucial as an outside runner to take the keying off Woodard whose rumbles up the middle were virtually stopped in 1976 by Texas Tech and Houston. Walker is a fifth-year senior who fulfills the exacting standards of wishbone-inventor Bellard.


