Leaders say to assert, relax, plan  
**Group counsel offered by Center**

Can you stand up for your rights? Assertiveness training is just one of seven group counseling aids that will be offered to students this fall by the Personal Counseling Service here on campus.

Other groups include Singleness Over 25, Relaxation Training, Life Planning for Women Returning to School, Marital Enrichment and a couples group.

Dr. Joyce O'Rear, a member of the staff, explained that the areas chosen for group representation reflect most of the questions and interests encountered by the Counseling Service personnel.

Assertiveness Training involves being able to express one's needs and learning how to handle negative as well as positive feedback. "It's focusing on learning how to stand up for one's rights in a positive way, without getting angry," O'Rear said.

"Singleness Over 25" provides a setting for discussion centered around the common interests, questions and concerns of persons who are single, divorced or widowed.

"The focus is on discussion with other persons here at A&M experiencing some of the same isolated feelings that come from being unknown and on a large campus," O'Rear said.

Relaxation Training teaches students general techniques of relaxation and how to handle various stress situations. The program proved successful last fall when it was conducted by Free University, O'Rear said.

The Career Planning Workshop is a general orientation geared to freshman and sophomore students who are having trouble deciding on a career choice.

"It runs on the assumption that a lot of students find the whole idea of a decision about what they plan to do as confusing."

"We want to get across the idea that it's not an automatic decision and also to help them to rate themselves on various factors that make career decisions easier for some people."

Married persons may attend the Marital Enrichment Seminar and the Couples group.

Betty Scott, director of these groups, said the Marital Enrichment Seminar is based on the premise that a good marriage can be made better by concentrating on certain principles of communication.

"It's not focusing on solving serious problems, but more how to provide tools to handle problems that may come up. It's sort of a preventive approach."

"The Couples group is more of a discussion framework where certain topics will be addressed, but it's up to the couples to address them rather than the leaders of the group."

For women over 25 returning to school, there is the Life Planning workshop, conducted by Dr. Theresa DiNuzzo.

"I want to help women who want to change their direction or add to their lives by coming back to school," DiNuzzo said.

"Life Planning is based on the belief that these women have special concerns and can benefit from a support group."

DiNuzzo stressed that skills such as assertiveness, making and problem solving, and career decision were the focus of the group. Guilt feelings women have as a result of their decision to go back to school were discussed, DiNuzzo said.

"What I'm trying to do is help them regain confidence in their ability and to understand their uses and interests in relation to their career," she said.

The board of consultants for the Center for Education and Research in Free Enterprise will meet Wednesday at the Texas A&M University. The board announced Chairman Rex B. Grey, of La Grange, is a prominent Texan chosen for private sector to act as advisor to the Texas A&M center. The center was created by the Texas A&M University System Board of Regents in 1975. Other members of the board include five Texas A&M faculty members.

The center, aided by a gift by the Association of University Students and the Texas A&M University Development Foundation, was organized to bring together authorities in varied disciplines to work toward improved understanding among Americans through education and research.

Other citizens serving on the board include James Way and Robert Little III of Houston, Norman Moser of Dallas, Felix McKnight of Dallas.

Deans include Dr. H. O. Perason, College of Business Administration; Dr. Frank Hubert, College of Education; J. Benson, College of Engineering; and Dr. W. David Maxwell, College of Liberal Arts. Maxwell also is board secretary.
