

Watergate reporter reveals media attempts to cover for CIA agents

NEW YORK — Investigative reporter Carl Bernstein says some of the most influential figures in American journalism cooperated with the Central Intelligence Agency during the past 25 years. Bernstein, in a copyrighted story that will appear in Rolling Stone magazine Oct. 4, said at least 25 news organizations provided "cover" for CIA employees masquerading as journalists abroad. Journalists provided a full range of clandestine services — from intelligence collection to serving as go-betweens with spies in Communist countries," he wrote. He said such news executives as William Paley of CBS, the late Henry Luce of Time, the late Arthur Hays Sulzberger of The New York Times, the late Philip Graham of the Washington Post, Barry S. Graham Sr. of The Louisville Courier-Journal and the late James H. Murray of the Copley News Service got their cooperation to the agency. He said ABC, NBC, United Press International, the Associated Press, Hearst, Scripps-Howard, Newsweek, Mutual Broadcasting, the Miami Herald, and the old Saturday Evening Post and New York World-Tribune also "cooperated with the CIA."

He said the news organizations mentioned were among 25 that "provided cover for the agency," but the New York Times, CBS and Time were "by far the most valuable of these institutions." Bernstein said columnist Joseph Alsop and his brother, the late Stewart Alsop, "undertook clandestine tasks for the agency." Alsop told UPI in Washington Sunday that he has never done anything he didn't believe in. "If you have a chance to help your country, it is your job to do so," he said. The Times said it "has absolutely no information to add" to a 1976 statement by Arthur Ochs Sulzberger: "I never heard of the Times being approached either in my capacity as publisher or as the son of the late Mr. Sulzberger." A spokeswoman for CBS conceded some of its correspondents briefed the CIA in the 1950s, but said "it was common at the time" and "all the news media did it — ABC, NBC, the New York Times, UPI." An editor on duty at the New York headquarters of Time said his superiors refused to comment Sunday because they hadn't seen a copy of the article. "On the basis of our own internal investigations, we are satisfied that

no current UPI personnel are involved directly or indirectly with the CIA," UPI Editor-in-Chief and Vice President H.L. Stevenson said. The Copley News Service, NBC, AP and Reuter denied any CIA ties. Editors on duty at the Washington Post, Newsweek and The Miami Herald declined comment. **Freezing stops beetle infestation of dried cereals**

LINCOLN, Neb.—Cereal and other dried foods that aren't used routinely should be stored in a freezer to prevent invasion by kitchen pests such as small beetles. The problem often increases in warm weather. Bob Rosell, extension entomologist at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, says most such beetles come from dried food products in cabinets, especially those that aren't used rapidly. "Although the adults may be meandering around on cabinets and in cupboards, the larvae are probably feeding in a hideaway somewhere nearby," he said. The only way to control the beetles is to find and discard the infested products.
