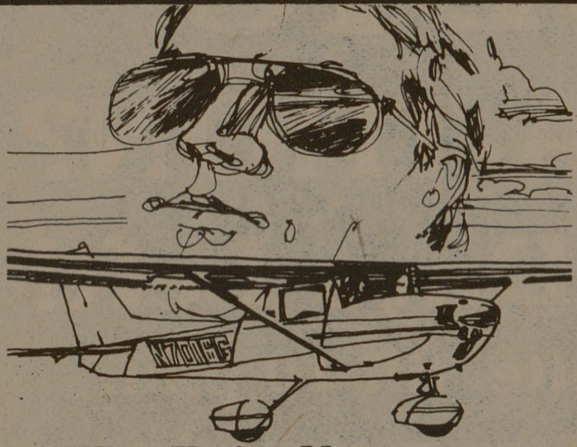

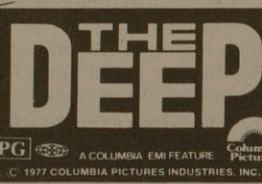

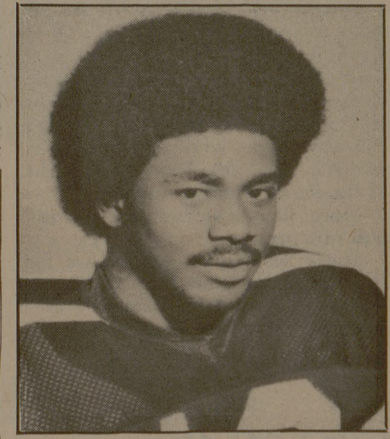

Williams has spotlight

This is the year that Mike Williams, Texas A&M's senior cornerback, comes out of the shadows and steps into the spotlight. During his Aggie football career he has played with the likes of Tim

Gray, Pat Thomas, Jackie Williams and Lester Hayes, all defensive secondary standouts who were drafted by the pros. Now, he's ready to take over and continue that Aggie tradition.

Quickness, jumping ability and athletic experience are Williams' strong points. A&M defensive coordinator Melvin Robertson, who specializes in coaching the secondary, says: "Last year was Mike's first to start and he has really matured. He's very quick, has great hands and he can jump. Another important factor is that he has some game experience and can help the younger players."

Mike and junior safety Carl Grulich are the two starters returning in the secondary. Joining them are junior college transfer Kenneth Taylor and sophomore letterman Jimmy Hamilton. Williams is high on both.

"They've both played a lot of football, in high school, junior col-

lege and here. Already we know each other's capabilities pretty well and I think we're going to have another good secondary."

Mike doesn't want to make comparisons yet, however. "It's difficult to compare our statistics because each year we have some new people in the lineup. This one will be no guarantee you."

Williams was recruited to Forest Brook High in Houston, both A&M assistant football coach Dan LaGrasta and Aggie head coach Shelby Metcalf. He played both sports his first two years, even got in a little basketball between the close of last football season and the Sun Bowl.

"It really helped me stay in school and kept me used to jumping. In preparing for each game, I says, 'I keep some mental notes here, tapping the side of his head.' 'It helps when I line up against a receiver. I go over films and remember little things like they line up and how they use the ball.'

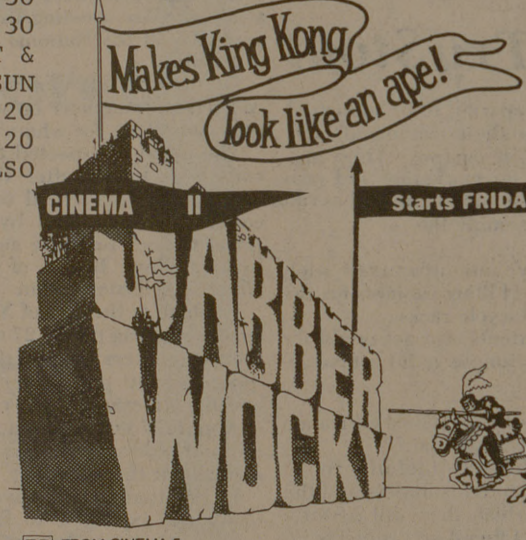
But each week is different. He has to be a leader, both on and off the field.

"It's simple, really. You do it right and you're a leader. That's a lot of pressure on me to do a job. A team can't win unless you have to perform."
