lege and University System, L.F. Peterson, said, "A&M must rank as one of the flagship universities of the state and of the country as well."
Peterson, an A&M graduate, said, "A&M is in good and capable hands in Jarvis F. Miller."
College Station's representative in the U.S. Congress, Olin E. Teague, was scheduled to speak but wasn't present because of congressional energy business.
His wife brought his speech, however, and John M. Prescott, vice president for academic affairs, delivered the remarks.
"A&M is advancing on all fronts," Teague wrote. "A&M is not just my school. . . It belongs to the nation." Teague said A&M is a "contributor to the welfare of our country."
Student Body President Robert Harvey represented the students in greeting Miller.
Dr. John Knox, president of the Association of Former Students, made a pledge of support on behalf of that group.
Chancellor Jack K. Williams presided over the inauguration ceremonies.
Susan Miller, one of the president's daughters, played the musical prelude on the organ with the Aggie Band, directed by Joe T. Haney, providing the processional and recessional music.
Professor Robert L. Boone led the national anthem and "The Spirit of Aggieland" and the Rev. Bob E. Waters, minister of the A&M United Methodist Church, offered the invocation. The Rev. W.C. Hall, campus minister for the Wesley Foundation, gave the benediction.

Health too costly

WASHINGTON — For the 26 million Americans who don't have health insurance, poor health carries an unusually heavy price tag.
Self-employed, unemployed, marginally employed, or students in such poor health they can't qualify have neither private insurance nor access to public programs like Medicare for the aged and disabled or Medicaid for the needy.
Most come from families with annual incomes of less than \$10,000.
While 8 million of them have other sources of aid like the Veterans Administration, the other 18 million are totally without protection against the soaring costs of health care, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare says.
At a national health insurance hearing Tuesday, HEW asked for testimony from others with an interest in drafting a national health insurance plan.
The American Medical Association planned to testify in favor of private health insurance that the existing insurance industry serves the American people more realistic in its objectives, manageable in its costs to individual families and to the nation as a whole, and simple as possible in its administration," Dr. William Felch of N.Y., chairman of AMA's commission on health care legislation said in prepared testimony.
Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., was expected to promote a plan that would be more heavily on public administration.
"The Carter administration at the beginning of its effort to develop a national health insurance plan that will adequately address the problems faced by the American people in obtaining and paying for good quality health care services," said the notice for Tuesday's hearing.
President Carter plans to submit his health insurance proposal to Congress early next year.
