Dog hero of '77 Man's best friend

DALLAS — Man's best friend gets a pat on the head Wednesday night during ceremonies honoring the Dog Hero of 1977.
A German shepherd named

Meatball, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Keith of Morris, Ala., will also be awarded a \$1,000 savings bond, a gold-plated leash and collar, a year's supply of dog food and a gold medal.

Meatball, winner of the 24th annual dog hero contest, surprised a burglar in the family's greenhouse and chased him to his getaway car where an accomplice was waiting. The dog grabbed the intruder's leg between his teeth and held on as the car sped off, dragging the dog 150 feet.

The 10 dogs selected as semifinalists were credited with saving a total of 11 lives. Since the program, sponsored by a pet food company, began in 1954, dog contestants have been credited with saving nearly 225 human lives and 300 animals.
