Private school aid near

Administrators of the nation's financially hard-pressed parochial schools — Roman Catholic, Protestant and Jewish — have been pushing to find a way to constitutionally bring Congress into "full partnership" with the nation's educational programs.

Faced with declining enrollments because of the mounting costs of tuition, the private school administrators are trying to find a way to reduce those costs while still providing a full range of services for their pupils.

Nearly every strategy that has been tried has faced severe court tests by strict church-state separationists who believe any type of public aid to parochial school amounts to a breach of the wall of separation.

There is some indication, however, that a near majority of the Senate is ready to consider the idea of tax credits as a potentially constitutional means to provide some aid to beleaguered parochial school parents.

Recently Senators Robert Packwood, R-Ore., and Patrick Moynihan, D-N.Y., lined up the support of 41 cosponsors on legislation that would give a tax credit to

almost every American who pays education tuition.

"We are facing an education crisis," Packwood warned in introducing the proposed legislation.

Going beyond the problems of religious schools, Packwood said is a decline in middle class enrollment that has become so acute that some colleges have been reducing school funds to parents' reduced interest to boost enrollment.

Under the Packwood-Moynihan proposal, a taxpayer would receive a tax credit directly from taxes paid for tuition for the taxpayer, or dependent. The amount of credit would be 50 percent of tuition payment up to a total of \$500.

In addition, the credit is refundable, meaning that if the payer is entitled to a credit greater than the amount of the tax liability, the difference will be refunded in cash.

Moynihan was candid about the difficulties the measure faced, comments introducing the bill. "Tuition relief is not yet a widely accepted idea," he said. "The bill would look at aspects, including the constitutional implications."

"It is widely known," he said, "that in recent years the Supreme Court—sometimes by closely divided votes—has not looked favorably upon measures that can be construed as aiding non-public schools."

Moynihan also said that while not well known, "for centuries aid was a familiar and widely accepted element of our public policies. Perhaps the court would take another look," he said.

While Packwood and Moynihan's ability to line up 41 cosponsors seems impressive it is no guarantee the measure will be proved by Congress.

Packwood said he hopes the Senate Finance Committee will pass the measure in the next few weeks.

Several similar measures have passed the Senate in the past, none have ever made it to the House.

On the other hand, the proposed legislation has going for it that it is not just aimed at religious schools.

The tax credit would extend any part-time or full-time student who attends an elementary, secondary, or vocational school or a college or university, including public universities that charge tuition.
