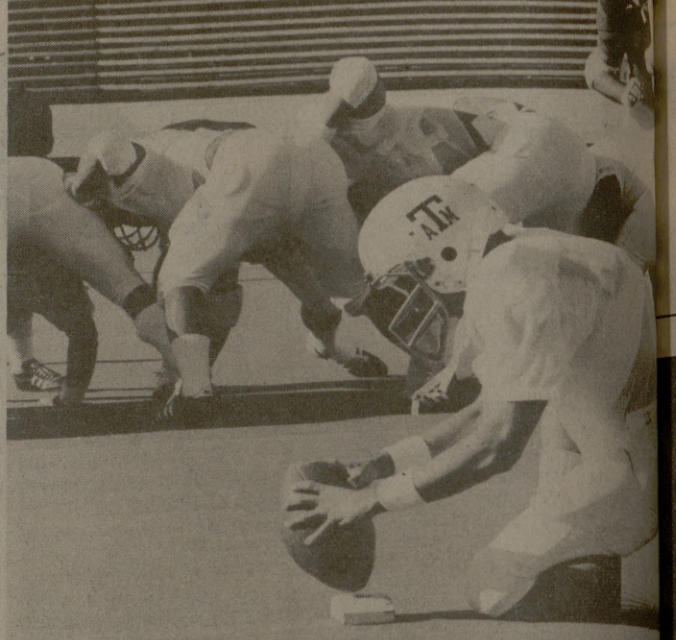
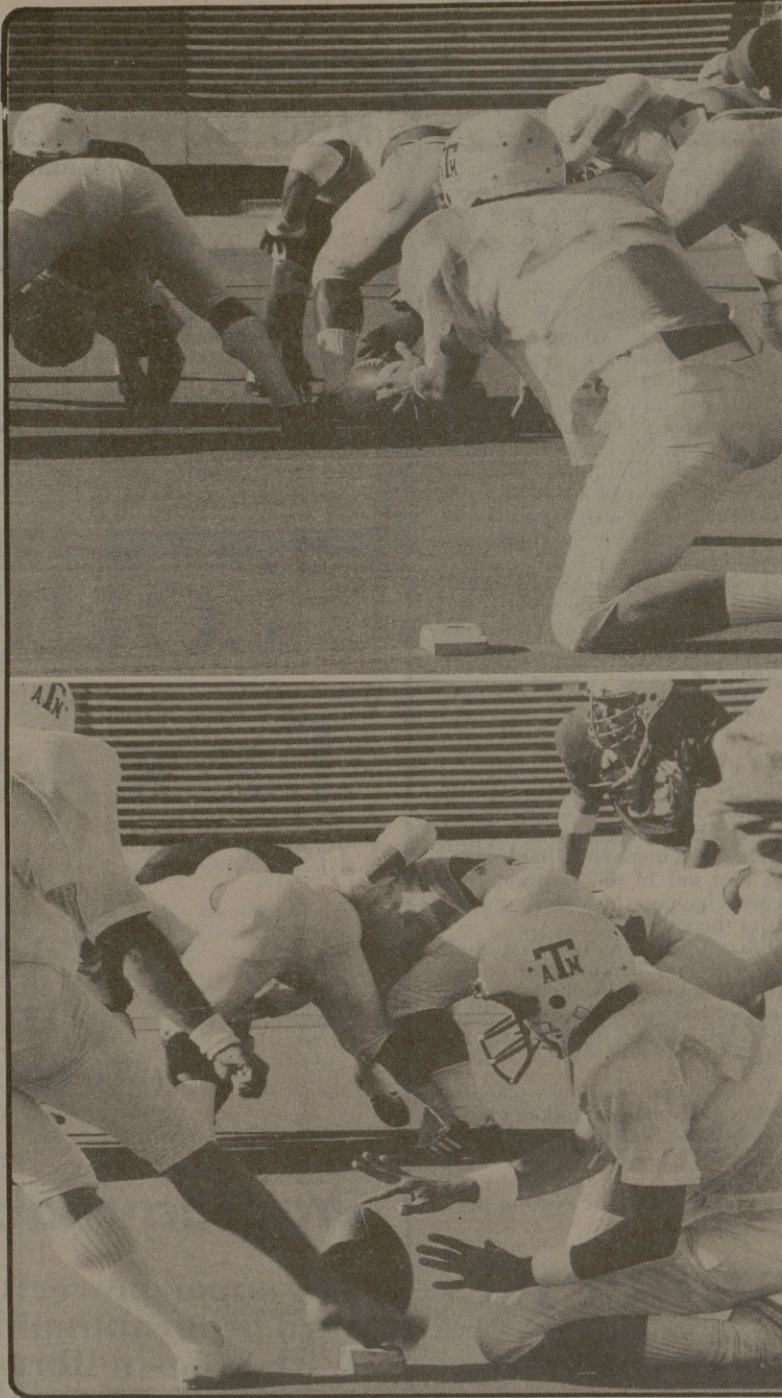

NCAA is after Oklahoma State

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — The National Collegiate Athletic Association has postponed, possibly until January, a hearing on alleged violations by Oklahoma State University.

The NCAA postponed Tuesday's scheduled hearing because of a "misunderstanding" about who could attend, said NCAA spokesman Tom Hanson.

Neither the NCAA nor Oklahoma State would elaborate on the reason for the postponement.

"The NCAA council regrets the misunderstanding. The council will make no further comments regarding the matter," said Hanson.

He said the council will try to hold a special meeting to consider the matter before the NCAA's January convention, but if an acceptable date can not be found then the matter would be considered in Atlanta Jan. 11-13.

The NCAA statement followed a report by the association's committee on infractions.

Reports this week indicated the

NCAA would set penalties including two years' probation with no television or bowl appearances, a loss of 15 scholarships during two years plus the ineligibility of junior defensive end Mike Edwards and sophomore offensive tackle Jim Clark.

Edwards and Clark along with head coach Jim Stanley and athletic director Floyd Gass had intended to attend the hearing Tuesday.

Others in the OSU delegation were faculty representative Ray Chapel, President Lawrence Boger, Vice President Norman Moore, legal counsel Charles Drake and lawyers Keith McMullin of Oklahoma City and Tommy Frazier of Tulsa, who will represent Clark.

Jim Treat, a Tulsa businessman alleged by the NCAA to have paid for a "signing party" for Clark, also was

to have appeared.

Clark, a star wrestler and football player, reportedly was ineligible for postseason football. At the end of the season, he was charged with the alleged infractions. He has proof that he is not guilty of any NCAA violations.

Edwards was alleged to have charged a trip to his home in Okla. City, Fla., to a Stillwater agency and never paid the bill.

A travel agency supervisor said an NCAA investigator it was charged with unpaid bills. Edwards' travel bill because of a football player who would school four years so it could be collected. The NCAA, however, apparently saw that as preferential treatment for an athlete, according to newspaper reports.


