Rover can't jog far at first

Dogs ease into exercise

DETROIT — If you've decided Rover needs more exercise, don't just dash off with him on your daily job around the block.

More and more dogs are accompanying their masters jogging, and a Detroit veterinarian cautions that dogs need conditioning just like their masters do before getting involved in vigorous activities.

"The first step is a thorough physical examination," Dr. W.J. Westcott said.

Dogs should be checked for heartworm and internal parasites said Westcott, past-president of the American Animal Hospital Association. Booster vaccinations may be required if they are not up to date and the rabies immunization should be current, he added.

"Your dog should be exercised throughout the year," Westcott said, "but a gradual increase in conditioning exercises is essential if strenuous jogging, hiking, hunting, field trials or obedience training is planned."

He said a regular conditioning and exercise program strengthens a pet's foot pads, muscles and cardiovascular system.

Dog owners also should discuss their pet's diet with a veterinarian.

"If your dog is going to be very active," Westcott said, "your veterinarian may suggest you increase his food intake somewhat as you accelerate the training and exercise program."

"When active throughout the

entire day, your dog may need or might enjoy a midday snack. And always be sure to have plenty of drinking water available."

He said pet owners should make sure their dogs are under control at all times and fitted with proper identification tags.

"You might even consider having your dog tattooed," he said. "Make it easy for a lost dog to be found."

"But the best advice is to keep your dog under control."
