SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE
For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
 2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
 3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
 4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
 5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
 6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
 7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other dates to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
 8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978.
- (This November 30th ordering deadline does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.)

A&M medical students told moral responsibility

Dr. Edmund Pellegrino of Yale University told Texas A&M University's first medical students Oct. 14 that they will hold the largest moral

responsibility in the practice of medicine.

Pellegrino, president of the Yale-New Haven Medical Center, said that responsibility was the key to the forming image of Texas A&M's College of Medicine. "I find it sad that many of the health professions confuse a white coat, an M.D. degree and a stethoscope with being a physician," he said.

Acting Dean of Medicine Dr. Elvin E. Smith said that the state's newest medical school had a "challenge and commitment to bring, without delay, the latest developments in medicine to the people of this state through a total commitment to true academic excellence and involvement."

Clyde H. Wells, chairman of the Texas A&M University System regents, told the assemblage that the board recognized the need for quality facilities and equipment. He said nearly \$3.8 million had been spent to launch the College of Medicine before the students met their first day of class.

Texas A&M President Dr. Jarvis Miller called the event an historic occasion for Texas A&M.

"We are pleased to provide an environment that is challenging," Miller said. "This provides a major

opportunity for this institution to offer a new kind of service to the people of Texas."

Dr. William Mayer, assistant medical director for academic affairs with the national Veterans Administration office, told the students much of what the Texas A&M program would become depended on their feedback.

Mayer said a soon-to-be-installed television network would further link the national agency, Texas A&M, Scott and White Hospital and the VA facilities at Marlin, Waxahatchee, Temple, where the Aggies will practice the clinical phase of the education.

Houston physician Dr. John Knox, president of the Texas Association of Former Students, said that the alumni firmly supported the program and were proud that Texas A&M had entered the field of medicine.

Associate Dean of Medicine Dr. William Ward introduced the members of the inaugural class, class president John C. Hodges. Dublin concluded the University of Medicine commission by acknowledging and accepting the challenges given the class.
