Aggie notes . . .

Don't be surprised if the Aggies automatically pack their bags again this week. It would be a normal reflex action since they've played five straight road games. But, starting Saturday against SMU, A&M plays four of its final five games at Kyle Field. A&M sold 22,000 tickets for the Rice game last week, most ever for a road in Houston.

Tony Franklin has had great success kicking field goals against Rice. he was 2 for 4 as a frosh, including an NCAA freshman record of 59 yards. he was five for five as a sophomore, which set a SWC record and tied an NCAA mark. Last week he hit two for two, giving him 9 of 11 vs. the Owls. Franklin is a perfect 17 of 17 in extra points this year.

A&M Coach Emory Bellard: "We did a lot of things that helped Rice. But, we won and that's what counts. We had many fine drives but would stop ourselves. Rice played hard and deserves a lot of credit."

Rice Coach Homer Rice: "I'm really proud of the effort of our kids. This is two weeks in a row that our young men did themselves, the university and our program proud."

Rice split end Dad Houser: "A&M has a fine secondary. They are a finesse secondary. They played man for man and I don't see a lot of that. It was fun. Mike Williams (A&M cornerback) is a super athlete. He covered me like a blanket all night. I respect him for his ability and his conduct."

A&M tight end Russell Mikeska from Temple has caught four passes this year and three of them have been for touchdowns. He also grabbed a two-point conversion pass against Rice. QB David Walker has thrown 6 touchdown passes this year which equals his total previous output. He threw three as a soph and three again last year. FB George Woodard needs one more touchdown to tie Joel Hunt's school record of 30 career TDs. The SWC mark is 49, by Bill Burnett of Arkansas (1968-70). Woodard also needs 65 yards rushing to become A&M's No. 2 all time runner. That would move him ahead of Bob Smith's 2,415 yards. Bubba Bean is the career leader with 2,846 yards. Curtis Dickey ran for 106 yards against Rice and now is No. 8 with 1,253 yards. He needs 212 to catch No. 7 John David Crow.

Joe Jares of Sports Illustrated, doing a story on place-kickers, saw A&M for the third time Saturday night at Rice. he was on hand when the Aggies played Texas Tech and Michigan. Jares talked with Texas' Russell Erxleben in Dallas Friday night, with

A&M's Tony Franklin in Houston Saturday with Arkansas' Steve Little in Fayetteville Sunday morning and was back home in California Sunday night.

Emory Bellard's Aggies need one more win to insure a winning season (now 5-1) which would give him four straight winning years (8-3, 10-2, 10-2, 10-2 this year). You have to go back to the 1920's to find another four-year winning record and no coach has as many games over that span as Bellard.

Texas A&M Basketball coach Shelby Metcalf has been very pleased with the way his 1977-78 squad has worked during the first week of preseason practice. "Everyone is working hard. We are a lot farther along at this point than we were last season, but we ought to be because we have much more experience," Metcalf said. "We have a lot of work to do because we are going to be up against some tough competition. The league looks very strong."

The Aggies are preparing for their season opener Nov. 28 against Angelo State. The team will probably hold intrasquad scrimmages Saturday morning before the SMU-A&M football game and the A&M-Arkansas game Nov. 12.

The Texas A&M men's and women's golf teams are both in action this week. The women are playing the Houston Baptist Invitational in Houston Monday through Wednesday. The men are entered in the Bill Bass Intercollegiate Tournament in Brownsville Thursday through Saturday. A&M is the defending champion in the tourney.

The Texas A&M women's volleyball team carries a 25-13 season record into the TIAAW Zone Tournament in Huntsville Friday and Saturday.

Last weekend the Aggies competed in the Southwest Missouri Tournament in Springfield, Mo. A&M lost four of five matches as injuries took their toll.

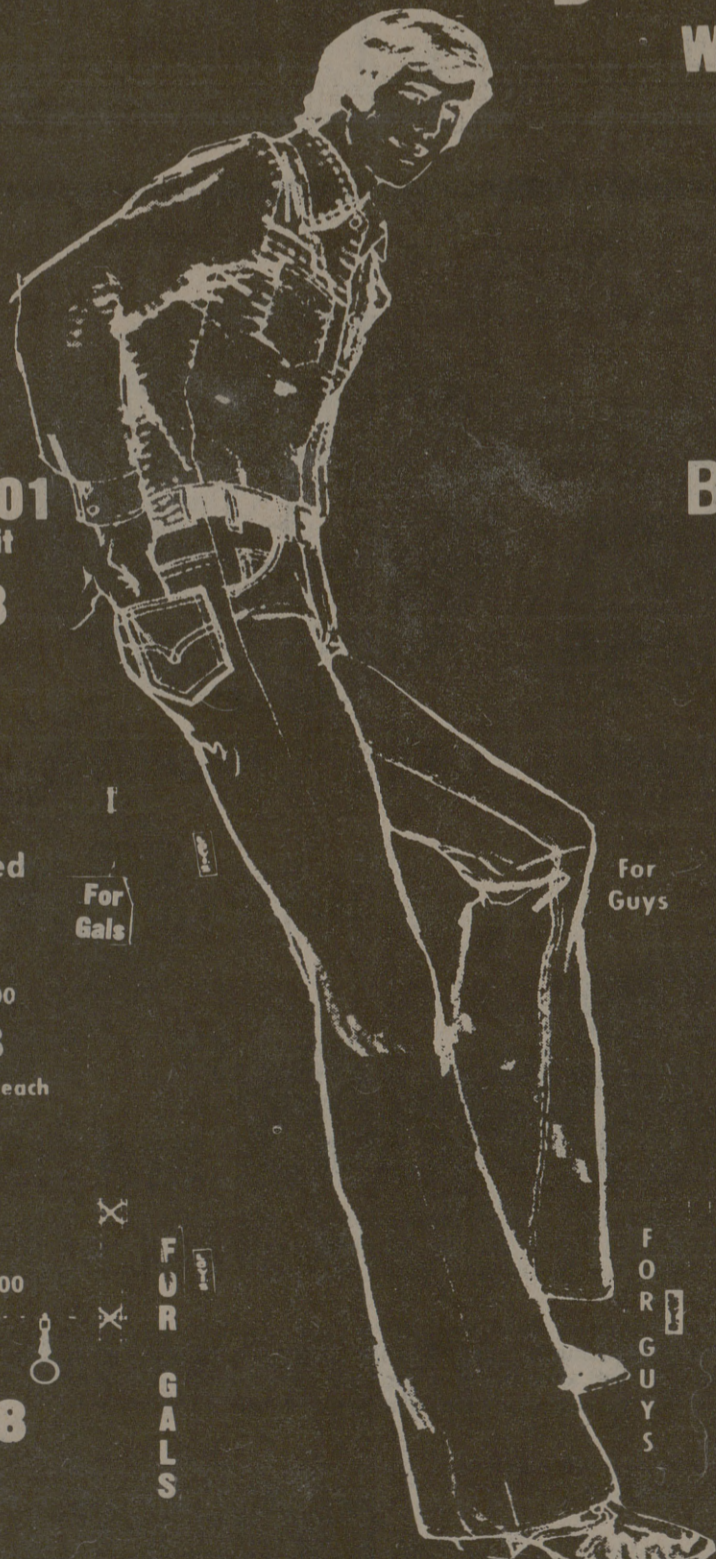
"Right now we've got 10 players hurt," coach Dave Schakel said. "We're hoping we can get most of them back for the zone tourney. The problems are mainly sprained ankles and knees, and those take time."

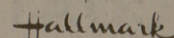
