Taxes increased in 1976

CHICAGO — Americans paid an average of \$731 in state and local taxes in fiscal 1976, an increase of \$67 per person from the previous fiscal year, the Commerce Clearing House has reported.
New Yorkers, who for 10 consecutive years paid the highest state and local taxes, came in second to Alaskans in fiscal 1976, the Chicago-based tax and business law publishers said Monday.
Per capita state and local tax burdens increased in every state during the fiscal year.
The Alaska average skyrocketed \$1,054 between fiscal 1975 and 1976, due to property taxes which shot up to \$400 million in fiscal 1976 from \$76 million in the previous year.
New York, in second place at \$1,140, was the only other state to pass the \$1,000 mark in per capita taxes.

SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE
For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:
1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978.
(This November 30th ordering deadline does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a deadline, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.) 34130
