## Bibliography and index for library energy info

If you're doing research on any energy-related topic, the energy bibliography and index at the Texas A&M University library could help you. In its second year of operation, the computer-generated energy index is comprised of 4,700 items in nine volumes. Susan Lytle, research associate in charge of the bibliography and index, said recently, "The four-year project will ultimately include about 20,000 items, she said.

"This is a time-saving tool," Lytle explained. "The index was suggested by a group of faculty advisors to the Center for Energy and Mineral Resources who found it frustrating and time-consuming to use all the different volumes in the library to find energy-related literature."

Work on the energy index is funded by a grant from the Center for Energy and Mineral Resources. "We spent approximately \$36,000 the first year and have the same amount funded for this year," Lytle said.

She explained that the bibliography and index consists of four indexes: one based on controlled terminology using selected terms from the Energy Research and Development Administration (ERDA); the key-word-in-title index using the natural language of the author; a personal author index; and a com-

bined corporate author and report series index for agency reports.

"The index provides access to all energy-related material this library holds, such as books, government documents, technical reports, maps and conference proceedings," Lytle said. "However, it doesn't include regular periodical articles."

"The bibliography and index covers the social, political and environmental aspects of energy."

The indexes are located at the fourth floor reference desk and in the government documents division on the second floor of the Sterling C. Evans Library. An introduction is included to explain how to use the index.

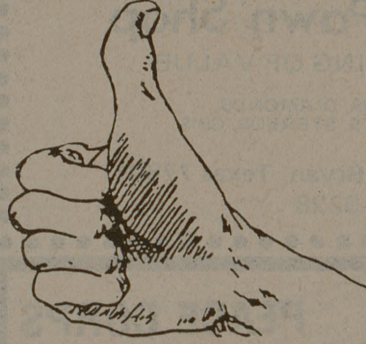

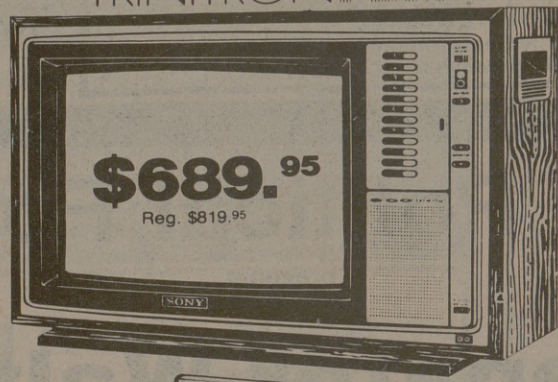
