# Amendment could shift money from small bank

United Press International AUSTIN—Passage of a proosed constitutional amendment allowing banks to use electronic fund transfer systems would shift money away from small and rural banks and expand the growth of bank holding companies, a candidate for state treasurer said Tuesday.


Harry Ledbetter, who is seeking the Democratic nomination for treasurer, said voters should defeat the amendment by voting against proposition Six on the special election ballot.

"The big banks' gun-for-hire is traveling around the state trying to convince suburban and small town bankers that their business will suffer without electronic banking," Ledbetter said.

"The truth of the matter is that the big banks' paid lobbyist are throwing up a public relations smoke screen to hide the real intent of Propostion Six, which is to make branch banking legal in Texas. The state constitution presently forbids branch banking, but Ledbet-ter said a U.S. Supreme Court rul-ing has determined electronic fund
