SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE
For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978. (This November 30th ordering deadline does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.) 3439

Amendment could shift money from small bank

—AUSTIN—Passage of a proposed constitutional amendment allowing banks to use electronic fund transfer systems would shift money away from small and rural banks and expand the growth of bank holding companies, a candidate for state treasurer said Tuesday.
Harry Ledbetter, who is seeking the Democratic nomination for treasurer, said voters should defeat the amendment by voting against proposition Six on the special election ballot.

transfer systems will result in a shift of depository money from suburban and small town banks to the big banks that are already well on their way to taking full control of banking in Texas," he said.

Ledbetter said state banks are being misled by lobbyists for big banks into believing that federal law will be changed to permit national banks to use electronic banking in defiance of the Texas constitutional ban against branch banking.

"Instead of surrendering to the

federal government, which says branch banking, our state treasurer ought to face up to his responsibility to represent all Texans by his voice heard in Washington against federal attempts to do the type banking our state has," he said.

Treasurer Warren G. Harrell appointed to the office to fill the expired term of the late Jesse E. Carter has indicated he will be a candidate for election to a full term, but it has not been formally announced.

Carter cuts foreign aid for Uganda and other

WASHINGTON — President Carter has signed a \$6.7 billion foreign aid bill which contains nothing for some Third World adversaries of the United States but represents a boost in worldwide assistance over last year, the White House announced Tuesday.

The bill, according to the administration, sought to redress the imbalance between the "haves" and "have nots" of the world. It cuts off military aid to other nations that, while not recognized adversaries are deemed to be guilty of human rights abuses. But there is no direct aid to Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia and Uganda, among others, in the bill and Carter ought to thwart even indirect aid to those nations by agreeing to instruct U.S. representatives in world lending bodies to vote against such assistance.

That point had induced a major skirmish between liberals and conservatives during debate in Congress.

Conservatives opposed even direct aid extended through global financial institutions such as the World Bank. But World Bank president Robert McNamara said Carter the American donation to bank would have to be rejected such a precondition was included in the bill.

To resolve the conflict, Carter said he would instruct U.S. representatives to international bank vote against the loans.
Congress also deleted from final bill a provision sought by Carter to give direct aid to Mozambique and Angola if the lawmakers agreed that such aid was necessary to further the foreign policy interests of the United States.

This year's aid bill marks an increase in funds for foreign assistance. Congress appropriated \$11 billion in fiscal year 1977.

The measure also bans military aid of any kind for Ethiopia, Uruguay and prohibits military credit sales to Argentina, Brazil, Salvador and Guatemala — all cause these nations allegedly to human rights to their citizens.

Included in the aid is \$1.8 billion in military and other help for \$750 million for Egypt, \$90 million for Syria and \$224 million for Iran.
