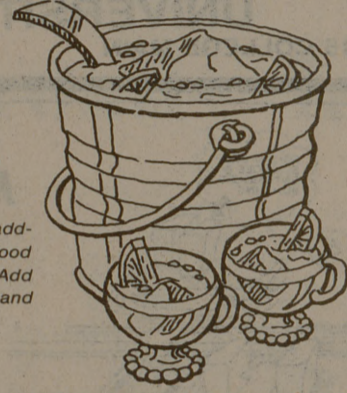

Porous surface stops skids New paving tested

A porous type of road surface currently being tested by the Texas Transportation Institute (TTI) at Texas A&M University has proven effective in reducing many of the hazardous highway conditions caused by rain.

Professor Bob M. Galloway of the TTI said the porous surface reduces vehicle hydroplaning and skidding for prolonged periods of time under heavy traffic, thus reducing accidents. Hydroplaning occurs when the car actually rides on the water.

"A film of water tends to stand on the surface of conventional pavements," Galloway said. "This film of water causes partial hydroplaning, which in turn is a major cause of accidents."

The type of pavement TTI is testing is an open-graded, high-void mixture that can be placed on existing pavement surfaces in layers of about three-fourths inch.

"Because of the high void content, water that falls onto the surface drains directly down into the porous surface, leaving the road relatively dry," Galloway said.

Friction increases on this type of surface to two or three times that of normal road surfaces, he said. There is also reduced splash and spray from tires, which is especially im-

portant at night because reflections from the water droplets can make it hard for drivers to see, he added.

Other advantages of the porous surface are: longer life of pavement striping, a smoother and a more quiet riding surface, reasonable costs, pleasing appearance and an absence of loose stones, Galloway said.

This type of asphalt surfacing has been in use since the early 1950's, Galloway said. Much operational success has been reported, but there have been some problems of pavement distress in certain areas. There could also be an increase in maintenance costs in some areas, he said.

A test section of the porous surface was paved two years ago on

Highway 21, west of Bryan. Sections have also been placed in Dallas, Beaumont and Lufkin.

"I'd say a large percentage of heavy traffic volume roads utilize this concept in some form," Galloway predicted.

The porous pavement was not developed by the Texas A&M, but they have been studying and testing the concept the past eight years, he said.

The TTI studies are sponsored by the Texas Highway Department in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Transportation and the Highway Administration. Funding is provided by the state and local governments.

Cheerleader to firewoman

DALLAS — Former cheerleader Sherrie Clark pressed 100-pound weights for a month to prepare for the fire department's physical ability test, and it worked.

Tuesday the 20-year-old Mountain View College student became the first woman to pass the test and become a fire cadet. Nearly

60 others have tried and failed in the past few years.

Clark said the most difficult of the five-part test was carrying a 100-pound dummy up a flight of stairs, down a hall and back up in about one minute while wearing 50 pounds of protective gear. She also was tested in handling a ladder and running with a fire hose spraying at full force.

Clark said the most criticism shown by critics was "where's the sleep."

"That's still a long way away. I'm pretty sure they will give separate facilities. There will be some changes," she said.

SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE

For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978.

(This November 30th ordering deadline does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.) 34130
