



Producers can't throw it away. The product has been classified as a threat to the economy and "environmental officials won't let you flush it down sewers or into streams," company president Howard M. Dean Jr., said.

This leaves the cottage cheese industry with up to eight billion pounds of excess acid whey annually and understandably, much effort has been put into finding a use for it.

A recent Food and Drug Administration decision to allow processed whey as an ingredient in ice cream—of which Dean is one of the top ten producers — gave impetus to the effort.

Now Dean has developed a method of conversion that it believes will turn an environmental nuisance into a nutritional profitmaker and eventually could have great significance for world nutri-

The new process turns out a protein concentrate from the acid whey. It has the consistency of condensed milk and it could be carried a step farther to make a powdered concentrate. Both products would be compatible for mingling with other powdered milks, Muck said. Dean expects to turn 250,000
