

Alcoholism, genes tied

KANSAS CITY, Kan. — New research indicates alcoholism might be linked to a biochemical hereditary factor, according to an authority on the disease that has affected nine million Americans.

"The cause of alcoholism, in truth, is unknown," said Dr. Donald Goodwin, "but it does run in families and this is a starting point."

Goodwin is chairman of the psychiatry department at the University of Kansas Medical Center and author of the book "Is Alcoholism Hereditary?"

"The notion that alcoholism is hereditary is old, older than theories that alcoholism comes from environmental factors," writes Goodwin. "For 75 years or more studies have consistently reported much higher rates of alcoholism in the families of alcoholics than in the general population."

Between 1970 and 1976, Dr. Goodwin conducted a two-part study to determine the influence of heredity and environment in alcoholism. For the first part, he established two groups of men, all of whom had been adopted in infancy. In one group, each man had at least one alcoholic parent. In the other there was no record of alcoholism among the parents. Results of the project were startling, Goodwin said.

"The children of alcoholics, both daughters and sons, were found to be four times more likely to become alcoholics by their early 30s than were those in the control group," Dr. Goodwin said.

During the second phase of the investigation Goodwin studied sons raised by their alcoholic parents and compared them with their brothers who had been adopted in infancy and raised by non-alcoholics.

Results of that phase of the study showed environment did not affect the development of alcoholism. The rate of alcoholism among the raised by adoptive parents was somewhat higher than that of group raised by the alcoholic parents.

"Severe or 'classic' forms of alcoholism may have mainly a genetic basis, whereas heavy drinking may have mainly psychosocial origins," says Goodwin. "The next step is finding what is being inherited."

The psychiatrist said the study showed 18 percent of the male children became alcoholics while 10 percent of the female children were affected by the disease.

"The usual explanation is a 'genetic' one," Goodwin said. "There is more tolerance in men than women."

SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE
For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:
1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978.
(This November 30th ordering deadline does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a deadline, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.) 3430
