SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE
For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:
1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room 374, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 28th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 28th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978.
(This November 30th ordering dead-line does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.) 34130

Bond issues go both ways across Texas

Building and road construction bond proposals Tuesday passed easily in Dallas and Corpus Christi, a similar issue in Austin and a proposal to counter the closing of the Air Force Base in Big Spring was rejected.
Dallas County voters approved proposals to build a new jail, renovate or build roads and bridges. The total bond package for the county was \$215.1 million, the largest ever for the county, and presented a test of confidence in county commissioners and a gauge of voters to protest federal government encroachment in local affairs.
The jail issue in Dallas County was the most controversial. It had when U.S. District Judge Sam Hughes ordered the county closed because of substantial conditions, producing a bit of controversy over a federal official being involved in county affairs. However, either as support for Hughes' decision or because of knowledge that the jail would be built regardless of how it was financed, Dallas County voters approved the issuance of bonds to build the new jail.
The roads issues were labeled detractors as examples of "partisan" politics by county commissioners and a chance for voters to round the controversy which had surrounded the commissioners in the past two years.
Voters in Austin, in effect, rejected two proposals which have led to expanded jail bonds and rejected a \$1 million proposal for construction of a county garage.
The key to the jail proposal is \$13.85 million proposed to build public safety building which have included a 370-room jail. That was rejected by 52.1 percent of the voters. Although the proposal was approved, it cannot be put into effect; it was a \$2 million plan to remodel space in the house left open by moving other public safety buildings.
