A Fonzie look-alike contest scheduled to take place in conjunction with the Jitterbug contest was cancelled when only one contestant entered.

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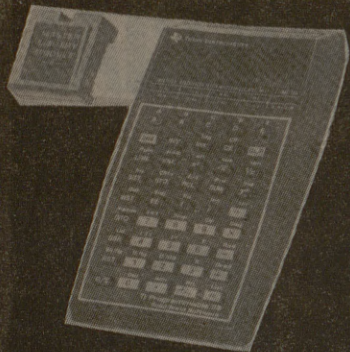

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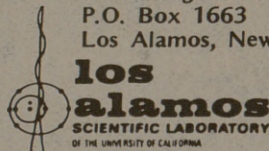
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
