SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE

For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:
1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978.
(This November 30th ordering deadline does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a deadline, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.)



Cut of fire defense pay

Rural residents of Brazos County may see their fire protection services vanish like smoke. County commissioners will meet Monday to discuss whether or not to continue paying Bryan and College Station fire departments for calls outside city limits.

"We're getting to the point where the county is being burdened by expenditures on fire protection," Commissioner Walter Wilcox said. "We may have to cut it off."

In August, the county was billed \$8,100 on fire calls by the two cities. These included grass fires and false alarms.

Wilcox suggested allowing volunteer units to handle rural fires, and calling for the city units only if necessary. Precinct 3 is in the process of setting up a volunteer department now. The unit has two fire trucks purchased by the county, and is arranging for training at Texas A&M University.

"We're gearing up to fight all fires, but we're going to need help

on house fires and major disasters," said Bill Klemm, a member of the volunteer force.

Klemm said that roughly 95 percent of the fires in the county are grass fires.

"We don't need assistance for grass fires," Klemm said. According to Wilcox, if the county does stop the payments, individual residents who have a fire will be responsible for paying the fire department. This presents a problem for residents can not afford to pay the fire department if they have a fire.

World animal control program set next week

Animal control has gone international and Texas A&M University will be host to participants from as far away as Barbados, Hawaii and Alaska during next week's Fourth Annual Animal Control Personnel

Development Program. The program, largest of its kind in the United States, is expected to draw about 150 public health veterinarians, animal control officers and county officials plus the natives and personnel of animal shelters and humane societies, according to conference director R. Wallace of Texas A&M Center for Urban Programs.

The county commissioners met at 10 a.m. in the Commissioners' Court at the Brazos County Courthouse.

Also featured Monday

Friday will be actress Gailan Pope, Cajun comedian Justin Wilson, State Rep. John Wilson and Grange and San Antonio City Councilman Glen Hartman. Hartman will open the program Monday with a presentation, "The Importance of Good Man's Animal Control." Pope, who is pet ambassador for the Pet Foundation, will be the luncheon speaker on Monday.

Wilson will discuss "The Impact of State Legislation Affecting Animal Control" at 10:50 a.m. Tuesday. On the final day of the conference the featured speaker, a.m. will be Cajun humorist Wilson, who will talk about dealing with animal owners and animal control officers.

John Hoyt, president of the Humane Society of the United States and Milton Searle, executive director of the American Humane Association, will discuss their respective organizations and animal control.

There will also be a number of veterinarians and officials presenting programs, panels and demonstrations. The purpose of the workshop is to provide technical assistance and inform individuals associated with the animal control profession of recent developments.
