Health center compares to Texas, Rice universities

Chicken soup and mother's care may be the best cure for a cold, but university students often have to settle for the services of the student

Five full-time doctors take care of the 400 to 500 students who come to the Texas A&M University health center daily. These students need no appointments to see a doctor and are seen on a first-come-first-serve

"There are not enough doctors for us to take appointments," said Dr. Claude Goswick, director of A&M's A. P. Beutel Health Center. "There is always a chance that a student would break their appointment and

not call to tell us.
"Meanwhile, the doctor would be waiting for the student when he could be seeing other patients."

But at the University of Texas in Medical Center, many of the stu-transportation service Austin, students need an appointment to see a doctor.

When they come to us without an appointment, we send them to the urgent care room," said John Wilson, university health center administrator.

There, nurses decide the seriousness of the patient's condition.

"If their problem isn't that urgent, they are given an appointment for the next day," Wilson said.

At Rice University in Houston, students need no appointments to see either of the two full-time nurses on staff at the health center, but do need one to see the doctor who is at the center on a part-time

"Our facilities are limited," said Dollie Fullen, one of the nurses. "But since we are so close to the

dents go there for treatment."

The Rice center, which has clinic hours Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., offers only emergency service on weekends.

The center has no pharmacy and refers students in need of specialists to a group in the Hermann Hospital Professional Building in the Houston Medical Center.

"It is then left up to the student whether he wants to see them or not," Fullen said.

The campus center, which Fullen says serves no less than 50 students per day, offers services including first aid and physical therapy. A gynecologist also comes to the center on certain days.

What are Rice students charged for these services?

"Sixty-five dollars per semester, said Mary Atkinson of Rice University Student Advising and Student Activities. "This includes health care as well as psychiatric counsel-

Unlike Texas A&M and Texas, Rice requires all of its students to have some form of hospitalization

"If they, or their parents or spouse have no insurance, we encourage them to take out our student policy," Atkinson said. "But it is mandatory that everyone have for the services of 18 gener

At Texas A&M, students are charged a \$14 per semester student health center fee. Clinic hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday. Emergency treatment is available 24 hours a day. Texas A&M has a medical center. We have two or rooms where we perform

with the University. To order at mid-semester

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.

2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.

3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.

4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their midsemester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.

5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only

5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977. 6. Students who do not place their order dur-ing this period may order after final grades

are posted.

The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday.

However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or


