SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE

For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978. (This November 30th ordering dead-line does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.) 34130

Ballet packs house

'Swan Lake' — excellent

A magical trip to Swan Lake treated a packed Rudder Auditorium audience Thursday night as the Opera and Performing Arts Society presented its third event of the season.

The Houston Ballet performed Tchaikovsky's "Swan Lake" with vitality, imploring the crowd of 2,500 to continually interrupt between dance selections to sneak in applause.

The story of the love-struck prince and princess began with an eerie prologue where the princess is transformed into a swan by the sorcerer.

Characterization was excellent. The villain sorcerer dripped evil from his emerald-colored costume and mask while the hero prince displayed absolute goodness, and even the dancers standing on stage developed characters through little actions — talking, nodding, smiling.

And the dancing was fantastic. Perfect coordination with the mood-changing music molded the leaps and turns into descriptive action flowing across the darkened stage.

The love of the prince and princess triumphed over the sorcerer's spell and all ended well.

Andrea Vodehnal, the star of the ballet, charged with physical exertion and excited at the crowd's standing ovation, talked quickly in her small dressing room.

"Swan Lake" is one of my favorites, probably because it is one of

the first I did with my husband," Vodehnal said as she pulled the earrings from her ears. A knock at the door, and she gave permission for her godchild to come backstage.

"Oh my God, my godchild? I thought she was this high," she said, waving her thin hand at knee level. "Is she old enough to be in college?"

Margaret McGuckin is a sophomore at Texas A&M. After the initial embrace and how-are-you, Vodehnal compared Rudder Auditorium to her home base Jones Hall in Houston as she removed her heavy eye makeup.

"Houston will kill me, but this is far better theater," she said, adding only that the floors "are a little bit on the feet and calves."

Vodehnal said ballet dancers attend a two-hour class every weekday, even performance days, to rehearse an additional two to three hours per day. All but about 10 percent of the dancers stop before 30, she said.

"I don't like touring much anymore," she said. The company will present the "Nutcracker's Swan" during the holidays and then the northeast in the spring.

MADISON, Wis.—A state official has told state and county mental health facilities they may ignore Secret Service requests for information about patients who express undue interest in public officials such as the president.

L.J. Ganser, administrator of the Division of Community Services, said Wednesday the state law on patient rights prohibits compliance with the request.

The law prohibits the disclosure of patient information without either a court order or the consent of the patient," Ganser said.

Thomas Zander of the Wisconsin Civil Liberties Union said the Secret Service bureau in Milwaukee sent

letters to all state and county hospitals seeking information on patients who have shown unusual interest in the president, vice president or families.

"When we learned about the Secret Service letter we notified state and county mental hospital directors that compliance would be a violation of state law, which prohibits confidentiality of mental patients," Zander said.

The memo by Ganser said the stitution should not make an exception to the rule unless it knows patient poses an imminent threat to another person.

Courses offer honors program spring semester

Ten undergraduate courses offer honors sections in the semester, announced Texas A&M University officials. Preregistration begins Nov. 28.

Honors sections, offered throughout the academic departments, coordinated by the university's program, give students a broader and deeper treatment of material selected teachers.

Other advantages of the courses include smaller class size, more stimulating classroom environment and honors classification which is noted on student's transcript.

To be eligible for the honors sections, students must post a minimum grade point ratio of 3.0 or a score 1200 or above on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).
