One man's four decade of service to Texas A&M will be recognized today when university officials and former students pay homage to **Walter S. Manning**, associate professor of accounting.

An evening reception and retirement dinner will be preceded by a special afternoon accounting conference named in honor of Manning, who completes 36 years at Texas A&M. About 300 practicing CPAs and industrial executives, some former students of Manning's, will attend the conference on current issues in accounting practices.

A retirement reception for the Youkum native, who was born on the 36th anniversary of Texas

A&M's founding, is scheduled for 6:45 p.m. in room 212 of the Memorial Student Center. The dinner will begin at 7:30 p.m. in room 226 of the MSC. Guests at the head table are expected to include Texas A&M President Jarvis Miller, Dean of Business Administration John Pearson and former students representing each of the four decades that Manning taught here.

Manning joined the Texas A&M University accounting faculty in 1941 after teaching at Robstown and Sinton public schools. He holds his undergraduate degree from Texas A&M University and his master's from the University of Texas. He became a CPA in 1952.

A Texas A&M University student has been named national president of the 510,000-member Future Farmers of America organization. He is the second Texan and Aggie elected to that position within a three-year period.

The new president is 19-year-old **J. Ken Johnson II**, Texas A&M freshman student from Nacogdoches and a rancher in his own right. Johnson was elected during

the Nov. 11 convention of the FFA in Kansas City, Mo.

Ken will then begin a one-year term of public appearances and speaking engagements as he participates in functions involving the more than 8,000 FFA Chapters in the 50 states, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

The agricultural economics major will leave his studies at A&M while serving as national FFA president.

Another Aggie, Bobby Tucker of Mineola, served as national FFA president in 1975-76. He has returned to A&M and is presently a junior working towards a degree in agricultural education.

Milsap to begin bonfire week

Ronnie Milsap and "Asleep at the Wheel" present bonfire and Aggie-Longhorn football week entertainment Tuesday at Texas A&M University.

A Town Hall Special Attraction performance, the show is planned for 8:15 p.m. in G. Rollie White Coliseum by the Memorial Student Center committee.

More than 800 seats are still available, says Town Hall chairman Ray Daniels, though rumor has the show already sold out.

Daniels says that as a Special Attraction, the Tuesday presentation requires separate tickets. No series passes will be honored.

The 1977 Country Western Entertainer of the Year, Ronnie Milsap twines strains of blues, rock and classical music into his country songs.

"I try to reach from as far left to as far right as I can in my music," the 1974 Country Music Association Male Vocalist of the Year said. "I like to play hillbilly one minute and rock and roll the next...like 1940 one minute and 1999 the next."

Country music-aimed from his earliest years, Milsap formed his own rock band, The Apparitions, with three other blind students in high school at the State School for the Blind in Raleigh, N.C.

Most remember the music lines straddling Milsap for "Daydreams About Night Things" and "Pure Love." Among others adding to the star performer's renown are "Legend In My Own Time," "I'm A Stand By My Woman Man" and "What Goes On When the Sun Goes Down."

"It Was Almost Like A Song" is a current big player.


