Manning joined the Texas A&M University accouting faculty in 1941 after teaching at Robstown and Sinton public schools. He holds his undergraduate degree from Texas A&I University and his master's from the University of Texas. He became a CPA in 1952.

A Texas A&M University student has been named national president of the 510,000member Future Farmers of America organization. He is the second Texan and Aggie elected to that position within a threeyear period.


Entertainer of the Year, Ronnie Milsap twines strains of blues, rock and classical music into his country
