# Army shows helicopter

A medical-evacuation helicopter from Fort Hood was to land on the Texas A&M University campus today and pick up an injured person from the polo fields on the east side of campus.

The event, scheduled for 2 p.m., is a demonstration of the Army's Military Assistance to Safety and Traffic (MAST) program and is open to the public.

After the landing, the helicopter

crew will pick up the "injured person," simulate first-aid and take-off for a hospital facility. Once airborne, the craft will return to the polo fields and the crew will give a brief explanation of the MAST project.

The exhibition is sponsored by Texas A&M's Health and Physical Education Department and the Texas A&M Emergency Care Team.

## A&M students win debate awards

Members of the Texas A&M University Debate and Forensic Club won honors in separate tournaments Nov. 18-19 in Louisiana and Texas.

At the 1977 Red River Forensics Classic hosted by Louisiana State University in Shreveport, debaters David Houston and Jeff Perkins won third place in Senior Debate. The two competed in the senior division against juniors and seniors from Texas, Arkansas and Louisiana.

The Texas A&M team also had members at the Southwest Texas Forensics Festival in San Marcos the same weekend. They competed with students from 29 colleges, universities and tied for the sweepstakes.

David Dally, Becky Parks, Diana Aldrich won Sweepstakes Awards, the highest possible honor, Copeland and Jimmy Jolly were defeated.

The Texas A&M speakers won awards at the Festival to give third place trophy, Dorothy DeBate and Forensics coach, the team has won 31 awards in a year, which exceeds the number for any previous year at Texas A&M.

## Dandruff cure may be harmful

CHICAGO—If you want a cure for dandruff, try something other than yeast tablets that contain selenium, the Journal of the American Medical Association reported in Monday's issue.

An overdose of selenium can be harmful to humans and fatal to animals, the article said. Yeast tablets containing selenium are sold as a cure for dandruff in health stores.

The article said selenium is an element which is difficult to measure. In normal amounts, it is less but an overdose can be harmful.

#### SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE

For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978.

(This November 30th ordering deadline does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a deadline, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.)
