Egypt to host talks

CAIRO, Egypt — Egypt has formally invited Arab nations, Israel and the superpowers to preparatory peace talks in Cairo, but it may end facing Israel alone across the negotiating table.

President Anwar Sadat proposed the preparatory talks Saturday and said he hoped they would "finish what we started" when he visited Israel, the first Arab leader to do so since the Iewish state was founded

Sunday night in a series of quick meetings with the ambassadors of the United States, the Soviet Union, Syria and Jordan and the Lebanese charge d'affaires.


