Deer hunters do well

AUSTIN — Deer season had a good start this year, with hunting better than average in many areas of the state, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department reported Tuesday.

The first two weekends of the season, unlike last year's cold, rainy season, were mild and dry enough to attract a large number of hunters into the field, the agency said.

Body conditions of deer varied

from county to county and region to region, wildlife biologists said. Hill Country deer primarily were lean, but some of the bucks had good antler development, they said.

From Cherokee County south, hunters fared above average, primarily because dry weather conditions allowed good access to prime hunting spots, biologists said. Department officials said 96 bucks were harvested in Liberty County and 47 in Tyler County on opening weekend.

Hunters in some areas of East Texas had exceptional success and the deer were in very good condition, said David Synatzke, biologist in the Engeling Wildlife Management Area in Anderson County.

"The deer we examined were almost rolling in fat," Synatzke said. One 10-point buck dressed at 111 pounds.

Deer hunting was average in Northeast Texas, game wardens reported.

Six deer were killed on Monday at the Pat Mayse Wildlife Management Area, said Harry Taylor, department biologist in Tyler.

"The deer were young and in good condition," Haucke said. Fairfield district wildlife biologist Walt Daniel reported one buck that area field dressed at 135 pounds and storage and locker plants processed almost twice as many deer in previous seasons. One doe plant in Anderson County had deer on opening weekend.

Daniel said too many hunters were killing bucks and failing to take advantage of antlerless permits which could cause deer populations to suffer during the winter.

Deer hunting was slower than average in Bastrop, Caldwell, De Witt, Fayette, Gonzales, Lavaca and counties, agency officials reported.

The deer harvest was very good in the Permian Basin with a record 26-point buck killed near Big Lake. Most deer field dressed at 120 pounds with a few up to 120 pounds.

SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE

For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Fall '77 Semester

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 90 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, prior to November 10th. THIS MAY NOT BE DONE BY PHONE.
2. Bring mid-semester grade report along when ready to order to verify eligibility.
3. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring loans are available through student financial aid in the YMCA Building.
4. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their mid-semester grade report when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
5. Mid-semester orders will be taken only from October 26th until November 30th, 1977.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted.
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 A.M. - 1:30 P.M. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 26th or November 30th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately January 31, 1978.

(This November 30th ordering deadline does not apply to those students who completed 92 hours prior to the beginning of the Fall '77 semester. After a student has 92 hours on record there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send ring orders to the factory.) 34130
