Mechanics get training

Maintenance personnel in Texas A&M University's Transportation Center are completing in-house training this week that will help keep university vehicles running.

O.O. Haugen, Transportation Center manager, said the training in automotive electronics is necessary because of increasing vehicle sophistication.

Fourteen maintenance men have been in classes three hours each three nights a week, for three weeks.

Haugen said the improvement in their technical knowledge will continue "the good response we've been

getting from campus departments. It will help assure the best possible equipment operation."

The trainees' final test this week is a performance test on an auto using engine analyzer equipment.

Classes have covered basic electronics, starter and charging systems, ignition and exhaust systems and auto wiring. Trainees have been instructed in use of volt and ohmmeters and other types of troubleshooting equipment. Scope tuneup sessions have taken into consideration pollution control devices and electronic ignition systems.
