



Aggie rugby teams do well in tourney

The Texas A&M varsity rugby team came out on the short end of a 3-0 score against Minneapolis in the second round of the Houston Invitational Rugby Tournament, but rallied to win its other three games and secure the consolation prize.

The Aggie Maroon team received a fourth place trophy with a 2-2 record, while the women of Aggieland demolished all opposition and won the championship. The A&M ladies have not been beaten this year.

After drawing a bye in round one, the A&M White team played Minneapolis in the second round. It was a struggle from the outset with Minneapolis notching the only score, late in the second half, on a 25-yard penalty goal.

The teams fought to a standstill in a defensive battle. As it worked out, neither team would lose again.

Minneapolis went on to tie the Houston Heathens for the championship, after 4 periods of overtime. The Aggies took consolation honors.

In round three, A&M beat Kansas State University, 10-0. The Aggies had too much scoring power for the Kansas State champions who were frequently caught out of position.

Alan Jeffrey, at fly half, had an excellent game for A&M, scoring six points on two penalty goals. Robert Moorman scored A&M's only try, going over near the flag after a strike for Jeffries.

The matchup between the Ags and the Houston Rugby Club in round four was a thriller. It was won in overtime by the Aggies on a 25-yard kick by Craig Belew. With Houston ahead 4-0, late in the second half, Paul Rutledge, the Aggie winger, stole a Houston pass and streaked into the end zone to tie the score. The sides were level at the final whistle and the Ags won it on Belew's kick in overtime.

Round five was a romp for the tired White squad as A&M downed the Austin Huns 21-0. Billy G. Rich, the front row forward for Ags, opened the scoring with a Wood-like burst after receiving the ball, following a line-out. Alan Jeffrey converted and A&M led 6-0.

The Ags made it 12-0 after an excellent movement by the back and wing forwards as Frank Rutledge over for the score. Jeffrey converted the conversion.

A penalty goal by Jeffrey made 15-0 and the final score was 15-0. Fully taken try by Rutledge before the posts. Jeffrey's kick was good and the Aggies had shut out Austin.

The White team is now 18-0 this season. A&M plays the Houston Old Boys this Saturday, Dec. 3, 11 a.m. on the Main Drill Field. The one who has not seen the Bingham action can do so, before the Houston-A&M football game, as the Ags wind up their season.

WCT series well organized

United Press International ST. LOUIS - Ilie Nastase, Stan Stockton and Roscoe Tanner lead 32-man field for the 1978 \$175,000 St. Louis Tennis Classic to be held at the Checkerdome Feb. 6-12, it was announced Wednesday.

Lamar Hunt, head of Western Championship Tennis, told a conference the tournament will be one of five in the United States which players can qualify for the annual WCT finals in Dallas.

Tournaments also will be held in Philadelphia, Houston, Richmond, Va., and Birmingham, Ala. There will be WCT tournaments overseas in Milan, Monte Carlo, Rotterdam.

"Next year will be the first time there has been an organized calendar for our sport," Hunt said. "In the past there has been a lot of hickies and fighting and conflicts of schedules."

He explained that the WCT is part of the Super-Grand Prix sponsored by the International Tennis Federation. The Grand Prix includes 32 events leading to a championship final in January 1979.
