A&M helps economic education

According to a study done by the Joint Council on Economic Education in 1973, social studies courses tend to neglect the tools of economic analysis necessary for literate citizenship. Moreover, 36 states do not require training in economics economics. Only half of these teachers have taken a course in economics. The report also stated that only 22 percent of future teachers who have taken economics received instruction in methods for teaching

The same study showed that three out of four college students had not taken an economics course. Only two states, Texas and Arizona,

required a course in economics for high school graduation. In 1961, the American Economic

Association served as a co-sponsor of a year-long national television course in basic economics. The show was carried by 182 national stations and all educational television stations in the United States during the 1962-63 school year.

The program's objective was to help the general public, students and teachers gain a better understanding of economics. At the end of the course, the National Opinion Research Center conducted a study to measure the effectiveness of the course and to collect extensive information on what economics was being taught in high schools, how and by whom

THE TESTS showed that socialstudies teachers who had taken no college courses in economics did about as well as those who had taken a year or two of courses in eco-nomics. This reflected the short
