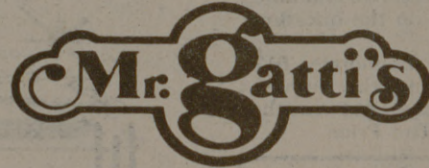

Jordan not to run for re-election

HOUSTON — Rep. Barbara Jordan, D-Texas, has declined to say whom she might support, if anyone, as her successor in the 18th Congressional District of the U.S. House.

"I'll trust their judgment," she said Saturday of her mostly black constituency.

Miss Jordan, 41, announced, "for reasons predicated totally on my internal compass," she would not seek a fourth term in Congress in 1978.

The decision ended months of speculation she would retire from political life for the time being. She refused to say anything about her future plans.

"This decision is made now — rather than two or four years hence — because I think it would become increasingly difficult for me to

change course," she said. "There, I believe, an inverse relationship between duration of tenure in Congress and the ability to change gears."

"What course I shall pursue in 1979 when my current term expires, I do not know. Whether in the public or private sector, I do not know."

Jordan said her experience in leave office had not been made a haste.

Since her election to the House in 1972 Miss Jordan experienced something of a meteoric career.

She was the first black congresswoman elected from the Deep South and was catapulted to national prominence by her freshman performance during the House Judiciary Committee's televised impeachment hearings in 1974.

Attributing that role to being in the right place at the right time, she said that was not her goal in Congress.

She said she had no immediate plans for setting up a law practice either in Houston or Austin, and she has no plans to seek a federal judgeship — which observers have indicated she wants.

In Congress, Miss Jordan helped write civil rights legislation, including expansion of the voting rights act to cover Texas, and was chief House sponsor of a new repealing so-called fair trade treaties which allowed manufacturers to fix minimum retail prices.
