
Since 1970, Kilby, a former xas Instruments official, has en self-employed as an intor and consultant.

Faber has written more than a dozen picture books, including "As I was Crossing Boston Common," nominated for the National Book Award.

A&M ocean engineers solve problem of eroding shorelines

More than 100 of Texas' 373 miles have to be used for artificial reof shoreline are eroding, claim Texas A&M University ocean engineers, but methods such as offshore breakwaters, groins, bypass pumping, seawalls and planting of vegetation can stop the encroachment.

Erosion, which can move the shoreline inland as much as 30 feet a year, is also affecting about 250 of the state's 2,125 miles of estuaries, says Dr. John Herbich and Robert Schiller Ir

They call for a "concerted effort by an aware public working with existing agencies to protect our

The two caution, however, that poorly placed or designed structures can do as much harm as good, aiding erosion of adjacent areas.

The engineers, whose work is partially supported by Texas A&M's Sea Grant Program, also predict that offshore sand will probably
