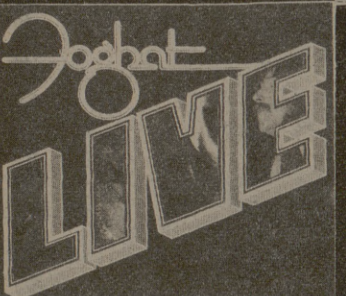

Ropers contribute most in points

Rodeo team second in region

The Texas A&M University rodeo team is off to a good start in this year's National Intercollegiate Rodeo competition.

The Texas A&M men's team is in second place in the Southern region with a total of 491 points, led only by Sam Houston State University.

Contributing more than one-half of the A&M teams total points are the men who compete in the team roping event.

John Anderson, a junior agricultural economics major, holds first place in the Southern region with a total of 124.5 points. Jim Standley is in second place and Johnny Powell in third.

Anderson, Standley and Powell are all past contestants at the National Intercollegiate Finals Rodeo. Anderson is presently in ninth place in the national standings.

Other men contributing to the over-all points are: Jim Price, third in saddle bronc riding; George Ward, fourth in bull riding; and Cody Dutton and Mark Ivy, second and fourth, respectively, in calf roping.

Mark Ivy is currently in fifth position for the men's all-around title.

The Texas A&M women's team is doing well also. The women hold third place in the region with a total of 186.5 points.

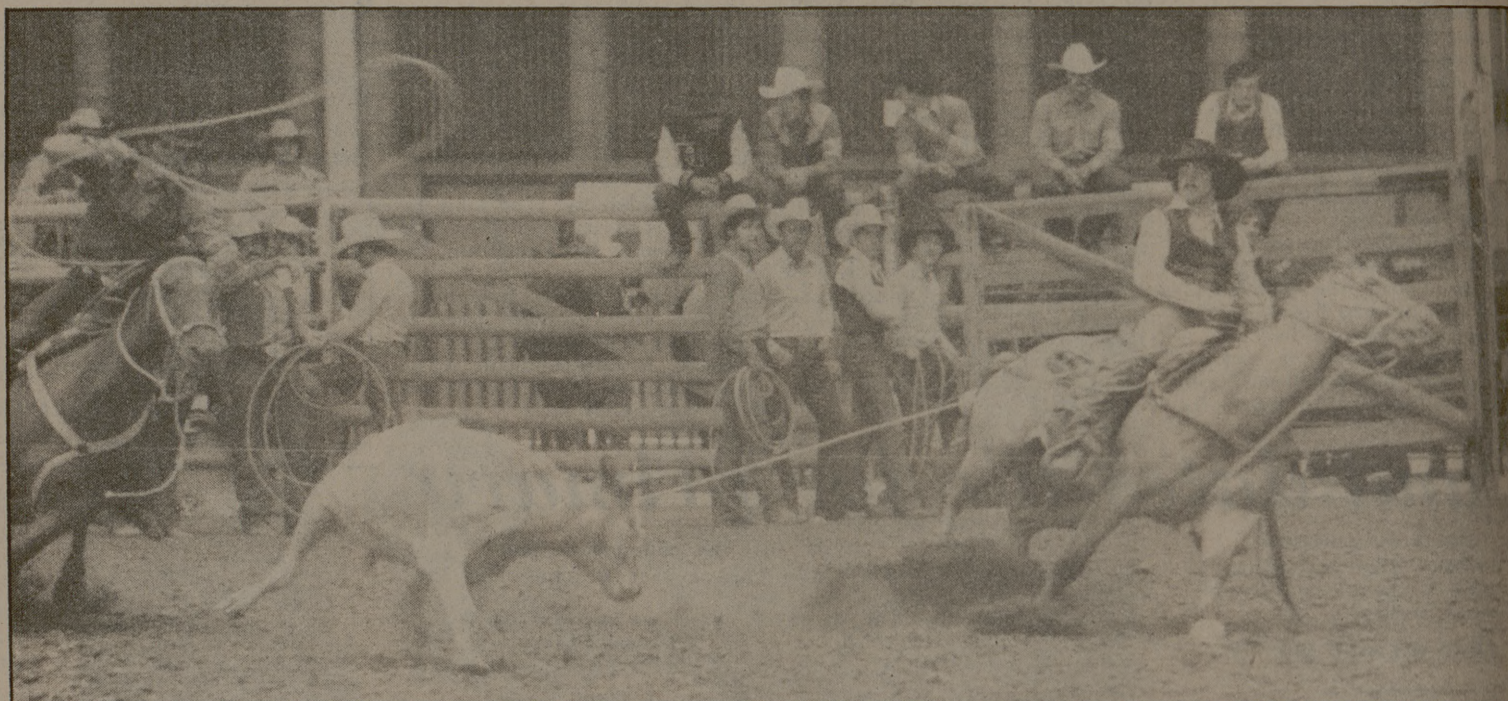
In break-away roping, Linda Fletcher is in fourth place and Beverly Acton is in fifth place in the regional standings.

Kay McMullan, a graduate of Texas A&M, is leading the goat tying event with a total of 142 points. McMullan also competed at

the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Finals last year.

Also contributing to the team's total points is Glenda Raney, who is in fifth place for the women's all-around title.

The rodeo club is open to all those interested in rodeo and in helping promote the sport of rodeo. Team members are chosen by their performance abilities.

Two for the road in trucking

NEW YORK — Driving a long-distance truck can be a grinding, lonely job, and to obtain good drivers some national firms are actively recruiting husband-and-wife teams for the open road.

"Despite the statistically high level of unemployment, there is a genuine shortage of good truck drivers," Peter de Wetter, president of Bekins Co., told UPI. "And the fact that over-the-road truckers have to spend so much time away from home is a handicap in finding good drivers."

This is in spite of the fact that truckers earn relatively good money.

Bekins guarantees husband-and-wife teams driving as independent contractors a minimum gross of \$43,500 a year. It guarantees single contract drivers \$36,000 a year and single contract drivers with a helper, \$46,000.

Last year one couple driving a moving van for Bekins grossed \$90,500. Four earned \$80,000, and most of Bekins' 110 husband-and-wife teams earned over \$50,000.

"We also have a few man-and-wife teams who drive our own rigs for straight pay but not many," de Wetter said.

"Owning their own rig and setting their own work schedules appeals to the average husband-and-wife team."

De Wetter said Bekins approves of the contract driving team for several reasons:

"First of all a husband-and-wife contract team are substantially more productive, and productivity is the name of the game in this or any other business," he said.

And he said the couple teams are good for the prosaic reason that the wife usually has a better handwriting than the husband and there's a terrible lot of paperwork in the business."

De Wetter said Bekins was a pioneer in recruiting husband-and-wife driving teams back in 1970, and the firm now is waging a campaign to add to the 110 contract driving for them.

A moving van nowadays can coast-to-coast in 3½ days if there are two drivers in the cab to share the work.
