To insure that financial aid funds are available at the beginning of the academic periods below, the following deadline dates for filing the Financial Aid Form are announced for your information and appropriate action:

Summer Session (12 weeks, only)	January 1	January 15
An Academic Year	April 1	April 15
Fall Semester, Only	April 1	April 15
Spring Semester, Only	September 1	September 15

*The Financial Need Analysis Report is provided to this office by the College Scholarship Service and is based on information contained in the Financial Aid Form. Normal processing time for a Financial Aid Form at College Scholarship Service (including mail time) is about two (2) weeks. Therefore, you should mail your Financial Aid Form to College Scholarship Service to allow sufficient time for proper processing and mail time.

Applicants for financial aid from Texas A&M University have to compete for limited funds. Deadlines are established so that all applicants are treated fairly and equally, without last minute haste. Financial Aid Forms submitted after the dates shown above will be processed only if time permits and funds are available.

'No' rule not enforced

You've got the munchies in your noon class. You unwrap a candy bar and you start to take a bite. That's when you notice the red and white sign saying "No food, beverages or tobacco products allowed in the classrooms or laboratories."

Many students and faculty alike do not abide by this rule and question why such a rule exists.

The regulation as stated appears in the Texas A&M University regulation handbook.

The rule originated several years ago at the request of a student senate committee whose members were bothered by smoking in classrooms.

It is not only students who violate the smoking section of this regula-

tion. Allison King, chairman of student senate rules and regulations committee, said she has seen who smoke in the classroom.

Since September 1975 it has been a criminal offense to be in possession of a burning or smoking product in public or private libraries or elevators according to the Texas penal code. To be considered an offense, the "smoking" sign must be prominently displayed and the building have ashtrays.

"Food and drinks left in the room increase the insect problem," said Edward Kozlowski, manager for maintenance in the department of facilities.

Bill Hutto, custodial superintendent said at present there is a insect problem in the classrooms. "The insect problem is in the classrooms, snack bars, and recreation areas."

Ron Blatchley, assistant director of student affairs, said no one has ever been turned in for eating, eating or drinking in the room.

Anyone can turn in a student violating this rule. Blatchley then takes disciplinary action, usually a verbal reprimand for offenders," he said.

As long as there is no problem or distraction, teachers do not let students take beverages into class.

"If I'm thirsty, I'll bring a class," said Jeff Tipton, junior economics major. "There is no problem in the rule. Teachers won't tell me to get rid of it."
