

Course in self-defense  
**Policewomen take training**

Training for policewomen April 17-21 at Texas A&M University will help the woman officer in dangerous situations.

The course will train policewomen in firearms handling, pursuit driving and methods of self-protection.

The 40-hour, one-week course will aid the women officers in areas not covered in basic training. The course will feature instruction by U.S. Customs Patrol, Federal

Bureau of Investigation specialists and driving experts of the Texas Transportation Institute.

"Behind the wheel" instruction will cover accident avoidance, wet weather driving and cornering techniques. The women also will be trained in self-protection and handling physical resistance.

Bill Cooksey, veteran Texas lawman, will coordinate the program. The course will be conducted at specially equipped facilities at Texas A&M Research and Extension Center near Bryan.



**A&M programs get \$28,000 aid from Du Pont**

E.I. Du Pont de Nemours Co. gave \$28,000 to Texas A&M University's engineering and science programs last week.

The check included a \$7,000 environmental grant for the oceanography program and \$7,000 each for the chemical engineering, mechanical engineering and plant sciences programs said Du Pont spokesman Marie Stewart.

President Jarvis E. Miller accepted the grant, along with Dr. Gordon Hopkins, head of mechanical engineering; Dr. Howard Joham, head of plant sciences; Dr. Bill Merrill of oceanography; Dr. Jerry Bullin of chemical engineering; Robert L. Walker, vice president for development, and Lou Van Pelt, placement director.

Stewart said the Du Pont educational support program will distribute about \$3.3 million to universities this year.
