To insure that financial aid funds are available at the beginning of the academic periods below, the following deadline dates for filing the Financial Aid Form are announced for your information and appropriate action:

*The Financial Need Analysis Report is provided to this office by the College Scholarship Service and is based on information contained in the Financial Aid Form. Normal processing time for a Financial Aid Form at College Scholarship Service (including mail time) is about two (2) weeks. Therefore, you should mail your Financial Aid form to College Scholarship Service to allow sufficient time for proper processing and mail time.

Applicants for financial aid from Texas A&M University have to compete for limited funds. Deadlines are established so that all applicants are treated fairly and equally, without last minute haste. Financial Aid Forms submitted after the dates shown above will be processed only if time permits and funds are available.

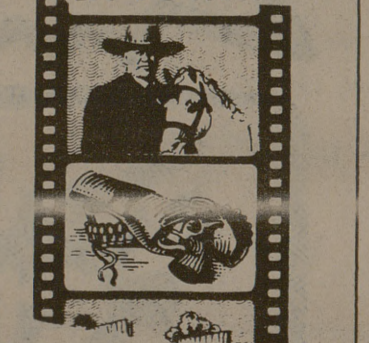

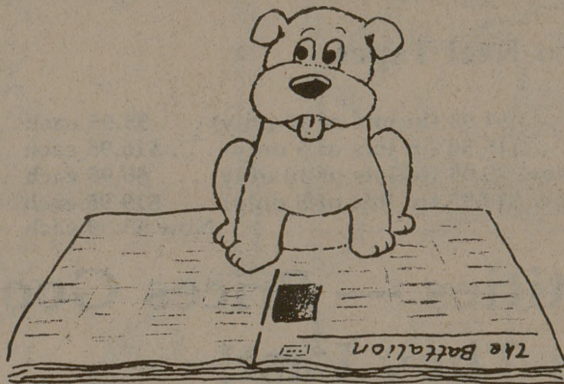

Court at full strength, Bakke case under review

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court was at full strength yesterday for the first time in weeks and facing the need to rule on "reverse discrimination" at the University of California and public sale of the Nixon White House tapes, among other issues.

Justice William Brennan, who had to miss the January sessions to take

treatments for a malignant tumor on a vocal cord, started the second half of the 1977-78 term with his colleagues yesterday. His doctor says full recovery is expected.

Since the justices have been in recess for four weeks, they faced a huge backlog of new cases at their private conference Friday. Cases accepted for review now will not be argued

until October at the earliest, the 1978-79 term begins.

Opinions on some of the cases heard were scheduled for Monday and Wednesday. It has been four months since the court took under advisement California's appeal from a decision striking down the state's special admissions program for minorities at the medical school at Davis.

The ruling favored affirmative action, but twice-rejected white applicants argued the program unconstitutionally discriminates against them. Richard Nixon has asked the court to block broadcast sale of 20 hours of White House tapes at the Watergate trial. Printed transcripts of the commercial distribution of the recordings would invade his privacy.

Privacy has also been the focus for an employer-attorney suit by government agents for health hazards to workers.

Press issues include: Access of reporters to the White House; Whether newspapers have an up ownership of broadcast stations in the city where they are licensed; Whether a state may investigate a judge; Whether police with a search warrant may search a newspaper for useful as evidence or whether a subpoena specifying the items is required.

Other pending cases include Tennessee's refusal to let desegregation in the state legislature; an age against an Indiana judge; a proved sterilization of a woman without her knowledge; whether the National Society of Professional Engineers must allow competitive bidding by its members.
