Board member announces

Feldman won't run

Roger Feldman, who was appointed to the A&M Consolidated School Board Jan. 23 to fill a vacancy, announced at Monday night's board meeting that he will not run for election April 1.

Feldman said he accepted the appointment in January knowing that he would only serve the unexpired portion of Position 7.

The January appointment was to fill the position vacated by Joseph Natowitz, who resigned to take a year-long fellowship at a chemistry institute in Germany.

Feldman had served for a six-month period in 1976. He said he resigned because of health prob-

lems, but had recovered when the board asked him to serve in January.

Three candidates have filed for Position 7: Walt Hardin, Herman Brown, and Bill Wasson. The filing deadline is March 1.

Feldman also endorsed Bruce Robeck's candidacy for the other open position. Robeck is currently serving as president of the board. He is the only candidate that has filed for Position 6.

Judge rules against police promotion cites discrimination

DETROIT—A federal judge ruled the Detroit Police Department's affirmative action promotion program is unconstitutional because it discriminates against white officers.

The 60-page ruling Monday by Chief U.S. District Judge J. Keess marked the first time a federal court has labeled a big city police department's affirmative action program unconstitutional.

It drew an angry reaction from Detroit Mayor Coleman Young, city attorneys said they would appeal.

Keess said the program, aimed at increasing the number of black sergeants in the department, violated "the rights guaranteed whites" by the 14th Amendment.

"Racial discrimination is not a defensible when practiced against whites as when practiced against blacks and it does not become 'reverse' because it is practiced against whites," Keess said.

Under the ruling, Keess said city must appoint its police sergeants in accordance with numerical ranking and without "violation" from the current eligible list.

Keess ordered a second trial to determine if awards should be ordered for 200 white officers passed over for promotion.

"The judge is wrong, and what is saying flies in the face of affirmative action decisions handed down across the country," said Young, who was in Washington when the ruling was handed down.

"If the judge is saying that hasn't been past discrimination in Detroit, then I want to know why he's been living in Detroit."

City attorneys said they were preparing an emergency appeal to the 6th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Cincinnati. Pending appeal, the city will make no motions to the rank of sergeant.

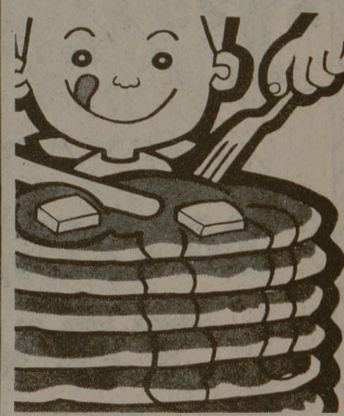

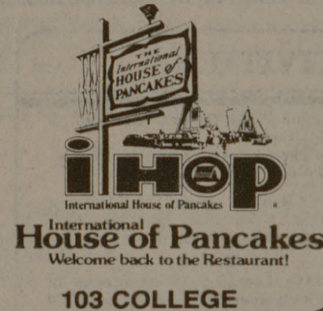
