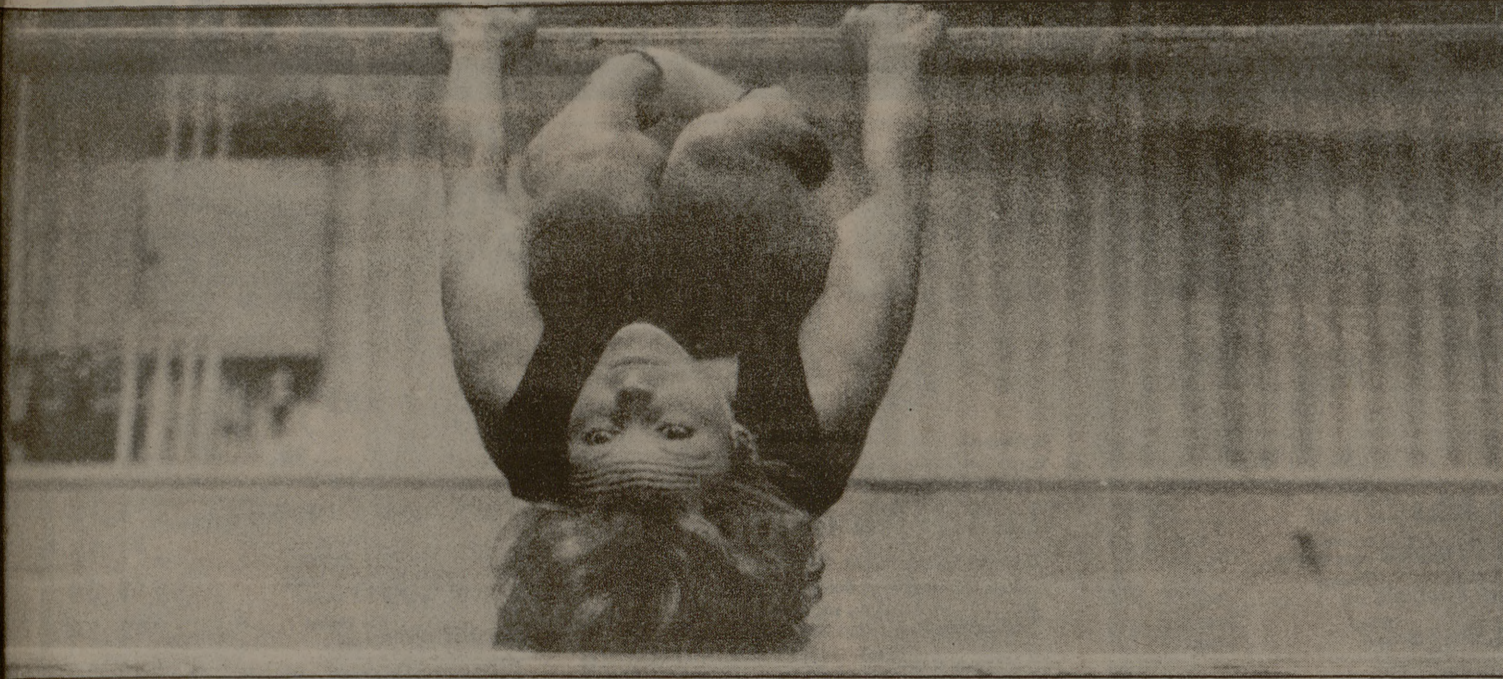


A&M gymnastics team wins state meet

In a TAIAW (Texas Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women) meet hosted by Texas A&M last Friday and Saturday at Bryan High, the Texas A&M women's gymnastic class I team took first place with a total of 192.6 points.

In second place was Southwest Texas with 166.65 and the University of Texas finished third with 163.85.

All five Aggie women placed in every event with the exception of Laura Shaffer who strained tendons on the top of her foot and was unable to complete the meet.

In the vault competition, Carolyn Smith of Southwest Texas won first place with a total of 17.1, and Patti Sloat of A&M was second with 16.8.

There was a three-way tie for third place between Tanya Hrabal of A&M, Debbie Kratz of Southwest Texas and DeeDee Whitton of TCU, all with a score of 16.45.

In the balance beam and uneven parallel bar competitions, the A&M team did a fine job by sweeping all first, second and third places. Hrabal took first (16.7), Sloat was second (16.4) and Kathy Pruett was third (15.85) in the balance beam.

In the unevens, Hrabal again took first (16.7), Pruett was second (15.95) and Sloat was third (15.75).

In the floor exercises, the Aggies finished well again. Sloat took first place (15.9), Tina Martin was second (15.45) and Patti Wimbish of Texas was third (14.85).

Sloat triumphed for the Aggies when she won all-around gymnast.

Hrabal finished second in all-around competition. The scores were 64.85 for Sloat and 64.50 for Hrabal.

The Aggies will compete next week in a regional meet hosted by LSU in Baton Rouge. They will compete against Oklahoma State University, Oral Roberts, Southwest Texas and LSU.

Bowling teams do well

The men's and women's bowling teams traveled to Dallas this past weekend to bowl in the state championships. The members making the trip were Jay Chester, Jerry Longworth, Mike Marak, Steve Martin, Mark Myrick, Mike Oliveri, Candy Burnett, Joy Lloyd, Terri McClellan, Denise McCutchen, Donna Minter and Nancy Schlotterbeck.

All the teams present at the tournament were winners in its respective divisions. After all the points were tallied, the A&M men's team finished in second place while the women's team took first. The final standings for the men were Houston first, A&M second and North Texas State third. For the women A&M was first, West Texas State second and North Texas State third.

The men's team bowled its first set against Texas Southern. They captured 18 out of 24 points. Longworth had high series with a 629 total. Martin and Chester had a 625 and a 625 respectively.

Longworth also had the high game with an excellent 276. Chester and Martin shot a 257 and 256 respectively.

Their second set was against West Texas State where they captured 21 out of 24 points. Myrick had high series with a 629 total. Martin and Longworth had second and third in the high series with a 625 and 622. Myrick bowled first high game with New Mexico. Martin and Longworth shot 10 and 232 respectively.

In the final set against Houston the men's team captured 10 points. State shot Chester had high series with a 612 and high game with a 214. Myrick and Longworth had high average for 3 and 209.

The women's team bowled its first set against Trinity capturing 21 out of 24 points. McCutchen had high series with a 612 total. Lloyd had second high series with a 550 total. McCutchen had high game with a 214 and McClellan took second high game with a 201.

The second set was against West Texas State where they took 15 out of 24 points. Lloyd had high series with a 550 and McCutchen shot a 552. High game was a 193 shot by McCutchen and second high game was shot by Lloyd with a 192.

The final set was against North Texas State. The women captured eight points. McCutchen had high series and high game with a 558 and 211 respectively. Burnett had second high series with a 493. McCutchen had had high average

for the day with a 191. The men's team average for the day was a 193 and the women's team average for the day was a 167. This weekend the teams travel to

Corpus Christi to defend their first place title, won three years in a row, in an invitational tournament at Ayers bowling lanes. The teams are also awaiting national bids.
