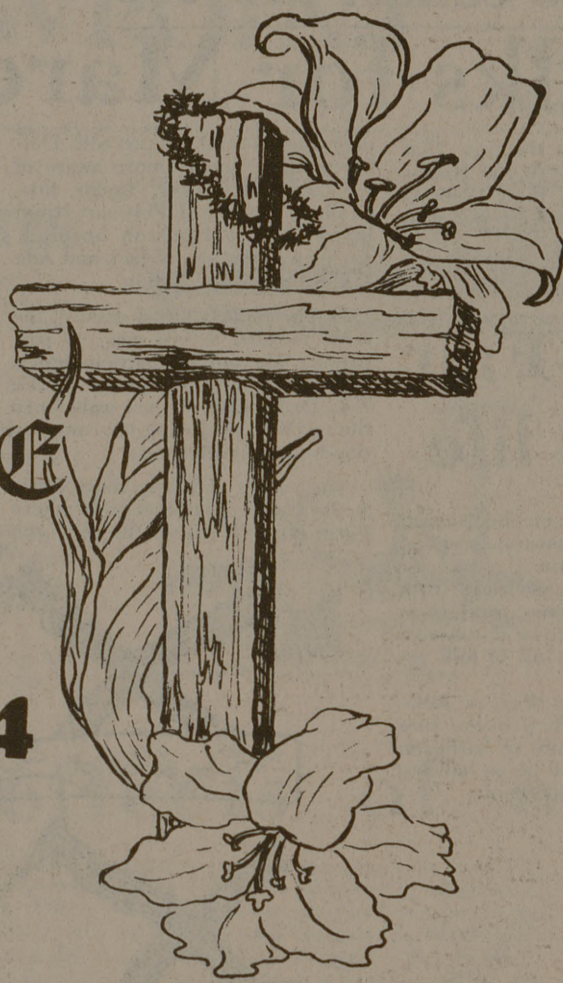

SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Spring '78 Semester

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Heaton Building, prior to Spring Break if possible, or at least one week in advance of ordering. **This may not be done by phone.**
2. Bring Mid-Semester Grade Report along when ready to order to verify passing hours.
3. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their Mid-Semester Grade Report along when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
4. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring Loans are available through Student Financial Aid in the YMCA Building.
5. Mid-Semester orders will be taken only from March 22nd until April 28th, 1978.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. (Whenever 92 hours have been completed and are on record, there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send orders to the factory.)
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, **Absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.**
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 22nd or April 28th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately June 29, 1978.

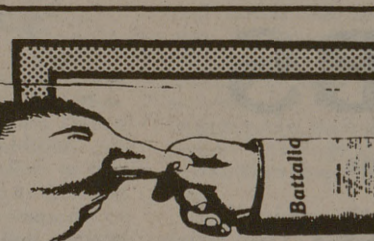

Ph.d and commissioning near for unusual student

An officers commission through the Army ROTC program and completion of doctoral studies in biology near for Tom Dreier, a Texas A&M University, graduate student.

The 27-year-old former Army enlisted man wears a Cadet Corps uniform three times a week for military science classes.

It's a quick, one-block walk from the Electron Microscopy Center, where Dreier works and studies, to ROTC classrooms. "That's the only time I wear the uniform," said the Minnesota native. His life is quite a contrast to the average full-time Texas A&M cadet.

Dreier will be commissioned in May. The two-year Army cadet then enters a delay in his military career, probably in the Medical Service Corps, to do his doctoral research and dissertation. It will likely be completed in mid-1980.

The military option Dreier has taken is open to other graduate students, through the two-year Army ROTC program, noted Col. James Woodall, professor of military science at Texas A&M.

"It's an unusual route to take," admitted the graduate student who has done work in serology, limnology and calls himself an aquatic biologist. He hopes to enter the field of microbiological research in the Army.

Dreier said the undergraduate cadets accept him in class. He has close friends among the future officers, most five or six years his junior. However, at first relations with other graduate students concerned Dreier.

"There's been no loss of respect with them though," he said. "It says a lot for other graduate students. They're open-minded."

After graduation from Mankato (Minn.) State College in 1972 Dreier was drafted 28 days before the national draft ended.

During two years service, he worked in an infectious diseases lab at Fort Baker, Calif.

In 1975 Dreier enrolled at Texas A&M for a master's degree in wildlife and fisheries sciences.

"To help Linda (his wife) with the bills, I got in the National Guard, with the 49th Armored Division headquarters in Austin," Dreier said. As with Col. George French, his boss at Fort Baker, the graduate student also received encouragement toward a military career from a 49th Division chemical officer.

Dreier chose the two-year pro-

gram and a commission from A&M over the National Guard officer Commissioning program. "It's different than going to other classes," Dreier observed. "Military classes cause a little concern with peripheral things like uniform appearance and hair. The work is not academically difficult, and we get into some interesting areas."

There's no family military tradition related to Dreier's effort. His father and grandfather were drafted to serve in World Wars I and II. In fact, his great-great-grandfather left Prussia to get away from the Army," he grinned.

Earlier military service has been Dreier's ROTC load. Once a graduate and attends officer training, he anticipates promotion from second lieutenant to captain.

His basic training was at Leonard Wood, Mo., which he tees laughingly called "Fort in-the-Woods, state of Missouri." "I was there in the winter of '72," Dreier said. "We learned to march in the fifth week, and it was right, slide...left, right, slide..."

New trial for policeman

United Press International AUSTIN — A former Amarillo policeman sentenced to death for the murder of a high school girl won a new trial Wednesday because jurors at his original trial were not told about a deal he was offered in exchange for a confession.

Jim Vanderbilt has been convicted of the April 1975 murder of Katrina Moyer, the daughter of former Rep. Hudson Moyer. The girl was abducted at gunpoint from an Amarillo high school, taken outside the city, and shot in the head.

A trial jury in Amarillo convicted Vanderbilt of the slaying, and sentenced him to death. The Texas Court of Criminal Appeals Wednesday reversed that conviction and ordered a new trial on grounds the trial judge violated

Vanderbilt's rights by presenting defense attorneys from telling jury about a deal District Attorney Tom Curtis offered Vanderbilt in exchange for his confession.

The written statement Vanderbilt gave the police was ruled inadmissible on grounds prosecutors had right to make a deal promising to seek the death penalty if Vanderbilt would sign the statement.

The judge at Vanderbilt's trial allowed prosecutors to present evidence concerning Vanderbilt's confession but refused to permit discussion of the deal.

Vanderbilt contended his conviction was induced by the prosecutor's offer not to seek the death penalty in the case, but the attorney said the oral confession was not subject to any arrangement that type.
