SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE For Students Completing 92 Hours at the End of the Spring '78 Semester

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M Senior Class Ring, an undergraduate student must have at least ninety-two (92) semester hours, with 30 hours at A&M and be in good standing with the University. To order at mid-semester using mid-semester grades to fulfill the above requirements, please note the following instructions:

1. Leave your name, major and I.D. number with the Ring Clerk, Heaton Building, prior to Spring Break if possible, or at least one week in advance of ordering. This may not be done by phone.
2. Bring Mid-Semester Grade Report along when ready to order to verify passing hours.
3. Anyone having failed to leave their name in advance and fail to bring their Mid-Semester Grade Report along when ready to order will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.
4. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Senior Ring Loans are available through Student Financial Aid in the YMCA Building.
5. Mid-Semester orders will be taken only from March 22nd until April 28th, 1978.
6. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. (Whenever 92 hours have been completed and are on record, there is never a dead-line, except a monthly mailing date on which we send orders to the factory.)
7. The Ring Clerk is on duty from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day, Monday through Friday. However, in order for other duties to be carried out, absolutely no orders will be taken between 11:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. or between 4:00 - 5:00 p.m.
8. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 22nd or April 28th, will be delivered on the same day which will be approximately June 29, 1978.

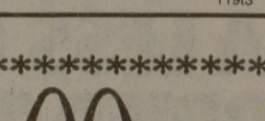

Applications for Fellows program due

Applications to participate in the 1978-79 University Undergraduate Fellows program must be submitted by April 4, says coordinator Melvin Friedman.

Students can make applications by submitting a cover page signed by their faculty research adviser, department head and academic advisor along with a proposal for research. Completed forms may be turned into Friedman in Geoscience Building 120D.

Eligible students are second-semester juniors with at least a 3.5 grade point average and who are enrolled in the University for at least a fall and spring semester.

Undergraduate Fellows may receive a stipend of \$450 per semester (three per semester) for the courses in order to pursue their research.

Final product of the year is a substantial senior honors thesis which the research is described and documented. The best of these will be awarded special prizes. More information is available 845-3251.

Puerto Rican sea pollution studied here

More than three million tons of pharmaceutical wastes have been dumped during the past five years in the Atlantic Ocean off the territory of Puerto Rico.

Texas A&M scientists are now involved in a multi-agency study to determine why the wastes are being discarded, what happens and how it affects the marine environment around Puerto Rico.

The dumped material, they claim, is primarily made of solvents and chemicals left over from pharmaceutical production.

Texas A&M's portion of the project involves almost \$250,000. Project coordinator Dr. Choo-Choo will be assisted in the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration study by Elliott Las; Farida Saleh, chemistry search assistant; oceanography search assistants James Brooks and John Trefry; Dr. Takashi Ichihara, associate professor Bobby J. Sley.
