Aggies host Rice Owls

The Texas Aggies will be looking for their first win in Olsen Field this weekend when they host the Rice Owls in a three-game SWC series.

A&M is in the throes of a four-game losing streak after dropping a pair of games Wednesday to Minnesota and USC. Since moving into their new 5,000-seat ballpark, the Aggs are winless in three tries.

"We're hurting a little right now," said A&M coach Tom Chandler after Wednesday's action. "We made four costly errors in that second game with USC and our pitching has been a little inconsistent as of late. Also, we've got a couple of injuries that are slowing us down."

Two of the Aggie starters who are ailing right now are shortstop Robert Bonner, who bruised his left shoulder in the Texas series last weekend, and centerfielder Mike Hurdle, who pulled a hamstring in the Wednesday game with Minnesota.

Another problem that has been plaguing the Ags in the last games is the inability to sustain lies. They hit into eight double plays in their last three games.

A&M will enter the Rice series with a 16-10 season record and a SWC mark. The Owls are 11-21 the year and 3-6 in conference. The Aggies will be trying to get into the upper echelon of the standings while Rice is battling survival. The league enters fourth week of competition.

Currently three teams — Houston, Arkansas and Baylor — are for first place with 6-3 Texas Tech is close behind. A&M and TCU are both 3-6 and Texas are 3-6 and SMU is 2-7.

Because of the various injuries among the A&M ranks, Chandler is unsure of the starting lineup for Friday at 3 p.m. in Olsen Field against Rice.

The starting rotation will include Mark Ross (2-3) working the top game, with Mark Thurmond and David Pieczynski (2-3) on the pitch Saturday's 1 p.m. game.

The rotation for the Owls includes freshman Doug Watson Friday, junior Allan Ramirez in the first game Saturday and freshman, Matt Williams (1-3) in the nightcap. All three are right-handers.

The bout between Thurmond and Ramirez in the first game Saturday is slated to be one of the top pitching duels this season as they were selected to the all-District team in 1977. Also, Thurmond is currently the leading pitcher in the SWC with a 0.00 ERA. Ramirez is second at 0.55.

The rest of Rice starting lineups will include junior Bob Hurdle in centerfield, sophomore Tom Baldwin at second base and senior Jeff Hays in left field. Freshman Jimmy Michaels is the catcher, sophomore Mike Grossman the designated hitter and senior Steve Fry at first base. Stan Hinson in rightfield and freshman Michael McLaughlin at shortstop.

Michalek and Hinson will have duty at catcher and in rightfielding the series.

Burnell is currently leading the Owls in hitting (.308), home runs (four), and RBI's (16). Grossman is their top hitter in SWC play.

The rest of the action around the conference this weekend begins at Arkansas, Baylor at Houston in a battle of two first-place teams. That's SMU at Texas Tech, Texas at Eastern Michigan and USC at Eastern Michigan and USC at Eastern Michigan.
